RESOLUTION 2022-658-A

A RESOLUTION HONORING AND CELEBRATING THE 100TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE FOUNDING OF THE GARDEN CLUB OF JACKSONVILLE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

11 WHEREAS, in 1922, philanthropist and society leader Ninah 12 Cummer, along with 17 other women, founded the Garden Club of 13 Jacksonville in her home on Riverside Drive where the Cummer Museum 14 now stands. Founding members focused on city planning projects, with 15 a particular focus on creating and revitalizing city parks; and

WHEREAS, the Garden Club was instrumental in creating spaces like Riverside's Memorial Park and preserving many of the city's ancient live oak trees. The Garden Club, along with philanthropist Jessie Ball duPont, helped rescue the historic Treaty Oak, a landmark located on the Southbank in what is now Jessie Ball duPont Park; and

21 WHEREAS, in the 1940s, Garden Club membership grew so large, it 22 became clear a clubhouse was needed. Between 1948 and 1958, the Garden 23 Club's campus expanded to house a larger space for meetings and events 24 to be the site of horticulture and design lectures, demonstrations, 25 exhibitions, and plant and garden sales; and

26 WHEREAS, now, in its 100th year, the Garden Club has more than 27 1,000 members, including 25 "circles", the traditional smaller groups 28 that made up the Garden Club in Ninah Cummer's day, which make up 29 around 60 percent of total membership. Members of the public can also 30 join as Friends members, which make up about 40 percent of total 31 membership; and WHEREAS, the Garden Club hosts several public events each month focused on environmental education and horticultural design and education for both adults and children, and holds regular public programs and horticultural shows to spread knowledge to the general public about the joys of gardening, the importance of environmental issues to the community, floral design, and more; now therefore

7 BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville: Section 1. The City Council hereby honors and celebrates 8 9 the Garden Club of Jacksonville on the occasion of the 100^{th} 10 anniversary of its founding and extends its best wishes for another century of service to the natural environment and the community at 11 large. The good work of the Garden Club helps to make Jacksonville 12 an exceptional place to live by highlighting the importance of the 13 natural environment and the beauty of gardening to elevating our 14 15 quality of life.

16 Section 2. Effective Date. This Resolution shall become 17 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective 18 without the Mayor's signature.
