AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING A \$395,394.00 GRANT FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF HOMELAND SECURITY THROUGH THE FLORIDA DIVISION OF EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT TO PROVIDE FUNDING FOR THE PURCHASE OF RADIO EQUIPMENT TO IMPROVE INTEROPERABILITY AND COMMUNICATIONS BETWEEN STATE COLLEGE PUBLIC SAFETY PERSONNEL AND LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES DURING VIOLENT AND THREATENING EVENTS, BY B.T. 22-120; INITIATED PROVIDING FOR OVERSIGHT AND REPORTING BY THE JACKSONVILLE FIRE AND RESCUE DEPARTMENT, EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS DIVISION; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

(c) Explanation of Appropriation:

The funding above represents an appropriation of \$395,394.00 in grant funding from the Department of

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Homeland Security through the Florida Division of Emergency Management for the purchase of radio equipment to support the goals and objectives of the State of Florida Interoperability Radio Project as described below. The grant period commences upon execution of the grant agreement by both parties and ends on March 31, 2023. No City match is required.

Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 2. Section 1 is to fund the purchase of radio equipment to improve communications between state college public safety personnel and law enforcement agencies when responding to violent activity, domestic security, or terrorist threat events. The Interoperability Radio Project supports a statewide effort to enhance coordinated operations between these agencies as a means to prevent and deter violent threats and events that occur on college campuses. This need was identified after the Marjory Stoneman Douglas incident when the post-incident identified gaps in interoperable communications review coordination. A copy of the Federally-Funded Subaward and Grant Agreement (Agreement Number: R0539) providing the terms and conditions relative to receipt and expenditure of the grant funds has been placed On File with the Office of Legislative Services.

Section 3. Oversight and Reporting. The Jacksonville Fire and Rescue Department, Emergency Preparedness Division, shall oversee administration of the grant described herein and shall be responsible for submittal of the required quarterly reports in accordance with the grant agreement.

Section 4. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
