A RESOLUTION HONORING AND COMMENDING JOHN PAPPAS FOR HIS DECADES OF SERVICE TO THE CITY AND THE CITIZENS OF JACKSONVILLE ON THE OCCASION OF HIS RETIREMENT FROM CITY GOVERNMENT; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, John Pappas, born in Jacksonville and raised in Tallahassee, graduated from Rickards High School and earned his Bachelor of Science degree in civil engineering from the University of Florida in 1985; and

WHEREAS, following graduation, Mr. Pappas began his career with the City of Jacksonville as an associate engineer and, upon earning his professional engineer's license in 1990, was promoted to Engineer Manager with the City's Maintenance and Construction Support Branch of the Streets and Drainage Division in 1999. In 2000, he became manager of the Paving and Drainage Design Section, then was appointed by Mayor John Delaney to the position of City Engineer in September 2002; and

WHEREAS, in 2007 Mayor John Peyton appointed John Pappas as Deputy Director of Public Works where he had oversight for the Real Estate and Engineering and Construction Management Divisions. He also managed the City's Stormwater Utility capital improvement program and policies associated with the utility's responsibilities. In 2014,

WHEREAS, John Pappas is the epitome of a true public servant, overseeing a massive operation with competence and capability; selecting, leading and inspiring a quality team of like-minded employees in the pursuit of efficient and effective service for the public good; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Pappas has been an invaluable resource to City Council members over the two decades that he has been in leadership positions in the Public Works Department, making himself available at any time and anywhere to answer questions, take phone calls, solve problems, provide information, and accompany council members as a resource to community meetings large and small to explain projects, field questions, and be an outstanding ambassador of city government; and
