AN ORDINANCE REGARDING PUBLIC SERVICE GRANTS; APPROPRIATING \$6,000,000 FROM A DESIGNATED SPECIAL COUNCIL CONTINGENCY ACCOUNT FOR PUBLIC SERVICE GRANTS; PROVIDING FOR CITY OVERSIGHT BY THE OFFICE OF GRANTS AND CONTRACT COMPLIANCE OF THE DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION; DIRECTING THE PUBLIC SERVICE GRANT COUNCIL TO REOPEN THE FISCAL YEAR 2022-2023 PUBLIC SERVICE GRANT APPLICATION SUBMISSIONS; WAIVING CONFLICTING PROVISION OF SECTION 118.802 (ANNUAL LUMP SUM APPROPRIATION FOR PUBLIC SERVICE GRANTS), PART 8 (PUBLIC SERVICE GRANTS), CHAPTER 118 (CITY GRANTS), ORDINANCE CODE, DUE TO THE NEED FOR SEPARATE LEGISLATION FROM THE ANNUAL BUDGET ORDINANCE TO APPROVE THE LUMP SUM APPROPRIATION FOR PUBLIC SERVICE GRANTS; WAIVING THE CONFLICTING PROVISIONS OF SECTION 118.803 (GRANTS ADMINISTRATOR RESPONSIBILITIES), PART 8 (PUBLIC SERVICE GRANTS), CHAPTER 118 (CITY GRANTS), ORDINANCE CODE, PERTAINING TO THE MANDATORY APPLICATION WORKSHOP AND COURTESY APPLICATION REVIEW BY THE GRANTS ADMINISTRATOR, OR HER DESGINEE, AS TO THE LIMITED GRANT APPLICATION PERIOD; WAIVING SECTION 118.806 (APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS), PART 8 (PUBLIC SERVICE GRANTS), CHAPTER 118 (CITY GRANTS),

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ORDINANCE CODE, TO AUTHORIZE THE PUBLIC SERVICE GRANT COUNCIL TO REOPEN AND ACCEPT GRANT APPLICATIONS DURING A LIMITED SEVEN (7) DAY GRANT APPLICATION PERIOD COMMENCING OCTOBER 1, 2022 AND ENDING OCTOBER 7, 2022; WAIVING SECTION 118.807 (REVIEW, EVALUATION AND SCORING OF APPLICATIONS BY PSG COUNCIL), PART 8 (PUBLIC SERVICE GRANTS), CHAPTER 118 (CITY GRANTS), ORDINANCE CODE, TO EXTEND THE DEADLINE FOR THE PUBLIC SERVICE GRANT COUNCIL TO PROVIDE GRANT APPLICATION SCORESHEETS TO THE GRANT ADMINISTRATOR TO OCTOBER 31, 2022 AND TO EXTEND THE DEADLINE FOR PUBLIC SERVICE GRANT COUNCIL ADOPTION OF THE TENTATIVE RANKING AND FUNDING ALLOCATION LIST TO NOVEMBER 4, 2022; WAIVING SECTION 118.808 (FUNDING ALLOCATIONS BY THE PSG COUNCIL; GRANT AWARD LIMITATIONS), PART 8 (PUBLIC SERVICE GRANTS), CHAPTER 118 (CITY GRANTS), ORDINANCE CODE, TO EXTEND THE DEADLINE FOR PUBLIC SERVICE GRANT COUNCIL ADOPTION OF FINAL FUNDING ALLOCATIONS TO NOVEMBER 18, 2022; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Appropriation. For the 2022-2023 fiscal year, within the City's budget, there are hereby appropriated the indicated sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) listed in subsection (b):

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(c) **Explanation of Appropriation** - The funding above is being appropriated from the designated Council Contingency account for Public Service Grants.

Section 2. The Public Service Purpose. Grant appropriation shall be allocated to the Acute, Prevention, and Self-Sufficiency categories of Most Vulnerable Persons and Needs as outlined in Exhibit 2 and shall be used only for the purpose of the listed Public Service Grant Appropriations and may not be transferred or reallocated for any other utilization within the respective department. Public Service Grants are subject to the provisions of Chapter 118, Ordinance Code. The appropriations made herein shall be awarded as grants-in-aid to the miscellaneous agencies and shall not require additional legislation for distribution of funds. Pursuant to Section 118.808, Ordinance Code, the Public Service Grant Council shall forward a complete list of the Public Service Grants recipients and funding allocation to the Council Auditor's office, the Office of the Mayor, the City Council and the Director of the Finance and Administration Department.

Section 3. Oversight Department. The Office of Grants and Contract Compliance of the Finance and Administration Department shall oversee the project described herein.

Section 4. Directing the Public Service Grant Council to reopen Fiscal Year 2022-2023 public service grant application submissions. The Public Service Grant Council ("PSG Council") is directed to reopen and accept additional grant applications during a limited seven (7) day grant application period. The proposed seven (7) day grant application period would commence on October 1, 2022, and end on October 7, 2022 ("Limited Grant Application Period"). The Limited Grant Application Period would be open to any requesting

agency who did not apply initially or whose application was submitted but not accepted due to untimeliness. As a result of the Limited Grant Application Period, the Council hereby adopts the extended public service grant application deadline dates set forth on **Exhibit**3 attached hereto. Additionally, the PSG Council is directed to reassess and/or rescore any Fiscal Year 2022-2023 grant applications scored by the PSG Council prior to the adoption of this ordinance, as applicable.

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Section 5. Waiving Conflicting Provision of Section 118.802 (Annual Lump Sum Appropriation for Public Service Grants), Part 8 (Public Service Grants), Chapter 118 (City Grants), Ordinance Code. The conflicting provision of Section 118.802 (Annual Lump Sum Appropriation for Public Service Grants), Ordinance Code, referring to "the annual budget ordinance" is hereby waived. Waiver of Section 118.802, Ordinance Code, is necessary because the Public Service Grant lump sum appropriation for the 2022-2023 annual budget will be considered by Council by this Ordinance 2022-509 and not in the annual budget ordinance 2022-504.

Section 6. Waiving Conflicting Provisions of Section 118.803 (Grants Administrator; Responsibilities), Part 8 (Public Service Grants), Chapter 118 (City Grants), Ordinance Code. The conflicting provisions of Section 118.803 (Grants Administrator; Responsibilities), Part 8 (Public Service Grants), Chapter 118 (City Grants), Ordinance Code, are hereby waived as to the requirement for a Mandatory Grant Application Workshop and courtesy application review by the Grants Administrator, or her designee, as to the Limited Grant Application Period. This waiver shall not prohibit the Grants Administrator or Grants Office staff from providing the application workshop materials to potential grant applicants or performing courtesy reviews of public service grant applications received during the Limited Grant Application Period.

Section 7. Waiving Conflicting Provisions of Section 118.806 (Application Requirements), Part 8 (Public Service Grants), Chapter 118 (City Grants), Ordinance Code. The conflicting provisions of Section 118.806 (Application Requirements), Part 8 (Public Service Grants), Chapter 118 (City Grants), Ordinance Code, are hereby waived to authorize the PSG Council to reopen and accept additional grant applications during the Limited Grant Application Period.

Section 8. Waiving Conflicting Provisions of Section 118.807 (Review, evaluation and scoring of applications by PSG Council), Part 8 (Public Service Grants), Chapter 118 (City Grants), Ordinance Code. The conflicting provisions of Section 118.807 (Review, evaluation and scoring of applications by PSG Council), Part 8 (Public Service Grants), Chapter 118 (City Grants), Ordinance Code, are hereby waived to extend the deadline for the PSG Council to provide grant application scoresheets to the Grant Administrator to October 31, 2022 and to extend the deadline for PSG Council to adopt a tentative ranking and funding allocation list to November 4, 2022 as outlined on Exhibit 3.

Section 9. Waiving Conflicting Provisions of Section 118.808 (Funding Allocations by the PSG Council; Grant Award Limitations), Part 8 (Public Service Grants), Chapter 118 (City Grants), Ordinance Code. The conflicting provisions of Section 118.808 (Funding Allocations by the PSG Council; Grant Award Limitations), Part 8 (Public Service Grants), Chapter 118 (City Grants), Ordinance Code, are hereby waived to extend the deadline for the PSG Council to adopt the final funding allocations to November 18, 2022 as outlined on Exhibit 3.

Section 10. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
