ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$1,120,000, INCLUDING A \$560,000 GRANT AWARDED BY THE RECYCLING PARTNERSHIP, INC. WITH A \$560,000 LOCAL MATCH FROM THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE (INCLUDING \$535,411.77 FROM THE RESERVE FOR FEDERAL PROGRAMS AND \$24,588.23 FROM THE GENERAL FUND - GENERAL SERVICES DISTRICT FUND BALANCE) FOR A RECYCLING EDUCATION AND OUTREACH CAMPAIGN, AS INITIATED BY REVISED B.T. 22-114; APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, OR HIS DESIGNEE, AND THE CORPORATION SECRETARY TO EXECUTE AND DELIVER GRANT AGREEMENT BETWEEN CITY THEOF JACKSONVILLE AND THE RECYCLING PARTNERSHIP, INC. FOR A RECYCLING EDUCATION AND OUTREACH CAMPAIGN; PROVIDING FOR CARRYOVER OF FUNDS TO FISCAL YEAR 2023-2024; PROVIDING FOR OVERSIGHT BY THE PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Appropriation. For the 2021-2022 fiscal year, Section 1. within the City's budget, there is hereby appropriated the indicated sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) listed in subsection (b):

(c) Explanation of Appropriation:

The funding above represents an appropriation of \$1,120,000, including a \$560,000 grant from The Recycling Partnership, Inc. and a \$560,000 local match from the City of Jacksonville (including \$535,411.77 from the Reserve for Federal Programs and \$24,588.23 from the General Fund - General Services District Fund Balance) to fund a residential recycling education and outreach campaign.

Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 2. Section 1 is to provide funding for a city-wide recycling education and outreach campaign with the goal of reducing residential curbside recycling contamination and increasing recycling participation among Duval County residents. Currently, the City of Jacksonville experiences a 19.49% contamination rate in collected residential curbside recyclables. This campaign is one tool to help in improving this rate while also engaging new customers for the recycling program. Campaign outreach will include a direct-to-citizen feedback campaign to reinforce proper recycling through use of direct mailers, issuance of "Oops Tags", and rejection of improperly prepared materials. inspection and tagging portion of the campaign will focus on approximately 280,000 households. In addition to providing grant funds, The Recycling Partnership, Inc. will also provide an in-kind contribution in the form of dedicated technical assistance and resources for the campaign valued at \$125,000.

Section 3. Grant Agreement Approved. There is hereby approved, and the Mayor and Corporation Secretary are hereby authorized to execute and deliver, for and on behalf of the City, an

agreement between the City and The Recycling Partnership, Inc., substantially in the form placed **Exhibit 2** with the Office of Legislative Services, including such changes as herein authorized, for the purpose of implementing a recycling education and outreach campaign.

The Agreement may include such additions, deletions and changes as may be reasonable, necessary and incidental for carrying out the purposes thereof, including providing authorization for the City of Jacksonville to subcontract with The Recycling Partnership, Inc.'s subcontractors to carry out the certain services relative to the recycling education and outreach campaign, as may be acceptable to the Mayor, or his designee, with such inclusion and acceptance being evidenced by execution of the Agreement by the Mayor or his designee. No modification to the Agreement may increase the financial obligations or the liability of the City and any such modification shall be technical only and shall be subject to appropriate legal review and approval of the Office of General Counsel, and all other appropriate action required by law.

Section 4. Carryover. The funds appropriated in this Ordinance shall not lapse but shall carryover to fiscal year 2023-2024.

Section 5. Oversight. The Public Works Department, Solid Waste Division, shall oversee administration of the grant and the Project described herein.

Section 6. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
