Appropriation. 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\$143,750.00 City match. The Jacksonville Fire and Rescue Department (JFRD) will use the funds to purchase one aluminum, open-ocean and inshore, CBRNE capable fire suppression hazmat response boat. The grant period of performance commences September 1, 2022 and ends August 31, 2025.

Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to provide funding for the Jacksonville Fire and Rescue Department to purchase one 37' aluminum, open-ocean and inshore, CBRNE capable fire suppression hazmat response boat. The Department of Homeland Security's Port Security Grant Program is one of a number of programs that are aimed at strengthening the nation's critical infrastructure against risks associated with terrorist attacks. The grant funding is awarded for projects and activities that increase port-wide risk management and protect critical surface transportation infrastructure from acts of terrorism, major disasters, and other emergencies in an effort to strengthen national preparedness and resiliency by enhancing maritime security. A copy of the Fiscal Year 2022 Port Security Grant Program Award Letter (Grant Number: EMW-2022-PU-00202-S01) providing the terms and conditions relative to receipt and expenditure of the grant funds has been placed On File with the Office of Legislative Services.

Section 3. Oversight. The Jacksonville Fire and Rescue Department, Emergency Preparedness Division, shall oversee administration of the grant described herein.

Section 4. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
