5 AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$394,136.00 IN GRANT
6 FUNDING FOR YEAR TWO OF A FIVE-YEAR GRANT FROM
7 THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES
8 FOR THE DUVAL COUNTY ADULT DRUG COURT PROGRAM,
9 AS INITIATED BY B.T. 23-006; PROVIDING FOR A
10 CARRYOVER OF FUNDS TO SUBSEQUENT FISCAL YEARS;
11 PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

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13 **BE IT ORDAINED** by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

14 **Section 1. Appropriation.** For the 2022-2023 fiscal year,
15 within the City's budget, there are hereby appropriated the indicated
16 sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s)
17 listed in subsection (b):

24 (c) **Explanation of Appropriation:**

25 The funding above is a SAMHSA grant from the U.S.
26 Department of Health and Human Services approved for the
27 Duval County Adult Drug Court program. This appropriation
28 is comprised of funds awarded for year two of the five-
29 year grant and covers the period beginning May 31, 2020
30 through May 30, 2021. No City match is required.

31 **Section 2. Carryover.** The funds appropriated in Section 1

1 of this Ordinance shall not lapse but shall carryover into subsequent
2 fiscal years. The grantor allows funds to be carried over through a
3 waiver that can be requested by the Courts in the event grant funds
4 are not expended in the current fiscal year and are anticipated to
5 be spent in the next fiscal year.

6 **Section 3. Purpose.** The purpose of the appropriation in
7 Section 1 is to provide additional funds for the Duval County Adult
8 Drug Court program. The funding will be used to expand the
9 collaborative delivery system of population focused care between the
10 Courts and local community-based care agencies. The funds will allow
11 the Courts to implement evidence-based treatment modalities to 40
12 unduplicated participants annually, with a goal of serving 200
13 participants during the five-year grant period. In addition, funding
14 will be used to increase available bed days for adult residential
15 treatment, increase the use of medication-assisted treatment, and
16 provide random, observed drug and alcohol testing. Intense substance
17 abuse/mental health treatment services and case management will also
18 be provided with various support services. Staffing will be provided
19 through current staff members. A copy of the Notice of Award is
20 attached hereto as **Exhibit 2** and incorporated herein by this
21 reference.

22 **Section 4. Effective Date.** This Ordinance shall become
23 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective
24 without the Mayor's signature.
