ORDINANCE 2022-770

AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$394,136.00 IN GRANT FUNDING FOR YEAR FOUR OF A FIVE-YEAR GRANT FROM THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES FOR THE DUVAL COUNTY ADULT DRUG COURT PROGRAM, AS INITIATED BY B.T. 23-007; PROVIDING FOR A CARRYOVER OF FUNDS TO SUBSEQUENT FISCAL YEARS; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Appropriation. For the 2022-2023 fiscal year, within the City's budget, there are hereby appropriated the indicated sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) listed in subsection (b):

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(c) **Explanation of Appropriation:**

The funding above is a SAMHSA grant from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services approved for the Duval County Adult Drug Court program. This appropriation is comprised of funds awarded for year four of the five-year grant and covers the period beginning May 31, 2022 through May 30, 2023. No City match is

required.

Section 2. Carryover. The funds appropriated in Section 1 of this Ordinance shall not lapse but shall carryover into subsequent fiscal years. The grantor allows funds to be carried over through a waiver that can be requested by the Courts in the event grant funds are not expended in the current fiscal year and are anticipated to be spent in the next fiscal year.

Section 3. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to provide additional funds for the Duval County Adult Drug Court program. The funding will be used to expand the collaborative delivery system of population focused care between the Courts and local community-based care agencies. The funds will allow the Courts to implement evidence-based treatment modalities to 40 unduplicated participants annually, with a goal of serving 200 participants during the five-year grant period. In addition, funding will be used to increase available bed days for adult residential treatment, increase the use of medication-assisted treatment, and provide random, observed drug and alcohol testing. Intense substance abuse/mental health treatment services and case management will also be provided with various support services. Staffing will be provided through current staff members. A copy of the Notice of Award is attached hereto as **Exhibit 2** and incorporated herein by this reference.

Section 4. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
