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ORDINANCE 2022-690-E

AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$350,880 FROM THE SAFETY & CRIME REDUCTION CONTINGENCY ACCOUNT TO A GRANTS AND AIDS LINE ITEM FOR GRANTS TO BE MADE TO ORGANIZATIONS RECOMMENDED BY THE SAFETY & CRIME REDUCTION COMMISSION AND FOR TRAINING OF SELECTED ORGANIZATIONS BY THE NONPROFIT CENTER NORTHEAST FLORIDA, INC.; APPROVING AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR AND THE CORPORATION SECRETARY TO EXECUTE GRANT AGREEMENTS VARIOUS ENTITIES AND AN AGREEMENT WITH THE NONPROFIT CENTER OF NORTHEAST FLORIDA, INC. FOR TRAINING OF NONPROFITS; INVOKING THE EXEMPTION TO SECTION 126.107(G), ORDINANCE CODE; WAIVING SECTION 118.107, ORDINANCE CODE; WAIVING SECTION 118.201(F)(7), ORDINANCE CODE; PROVIDING FOR OVERSIGHT; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. For the 2022-2023 fiscal year, within the City's budget, there are hereby appropriated the indicated sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) listed in subsection (b):

(c) Explanation of Appropriation

The appropriation above provides \$344,880 from the Safety & Crime Reduction Contingency Account to fund grants made to 43 organizations recommended by the Safety & Crime Reduction Commission and provides \$6,000 to the Nonprofit Center of Northeast Florida, Inc. to make available training assistance to the awardees. A list of these organizations receiving grant funding approved at the Safety and Crime Reduction Commission meeting on August 26, 2022 and the two additional entities which met the qualifications, is attached hereto as Revised Exhibit 2.

Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to provide grant funding and assistance to 43 organizations that have been recommended and approved by the Safety and Crime Reduction Commission as organizations that propose programs that can help reduce crime county wide. A portion of the funding (\$6,000) will be used to pay the Nonprofit Center of Northeast Florida, Inc. to provide training for the organizations selected to assist them with budgeting and compliance with the grant award.

Section 3. Approving and Authorizing the Mayor and the Corporation Secretary to execute grant agreements. The Mayor, or his designee, and the Corporation Secretary are hereby authorized to execute and deliver agreements between the City of Jacksonville and the entities identified in Revised Exhibit 2 in substantially the same form as is attached hereto as Revised Exhibit 3 and incorporated herein by this reference.

Section 4. Authorizing the Mayor and the Corporation Secretary to execute any and all documents necessary to effectuate

this legislation. The Mayor, or his designee, and the Corporation Secretary are hereby authorized to execute an agreement with the Nonprofit Center of Northeast Florida, Inc. for training of the entities listed in Revised Exhibit 2 and any and all documents necessary to effectuate this legislation.

Section 5. Invoking the exception to Section 126.107(g), Ordinance Code. The City is hereby authorized to procure the use of the services of the Nonprofit Center of Northeast Florida, Inc. and the other entities identified in the Revised Exhibit 2 to provide for services related to public safety and crime reduction. Pursuant to Section 126.107(g) (Exemptions), Part 1 (General Regulations), Chapter 126 (Procurement Code), Ordinance Code, such procurement is exempted from competitive solicitation because the supplies or services are to be provided by those specifically prescribed within authorizing legislation that appropriates the same. With the exception of the foregoing, all other provisions of Chapter 126, Ordinance Code, shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 6. Waiver of Section 118.107 (Nonprofits receive funding through a competitive evaluated award process), Part 1 (General Provisions), Chapter 118 (City Grants), Ordinance Code. The provisions of Section 118.107 (Nonprofits to receive funding through a competitive evaluated award process), Part 1 (General Provisions), Chapter 118 (City Grants), Ordinance Code, are hereby waived to allow for a direct contract with the Nonprofit Center of Northeast Florida, Inc. and the entities identified in Revised Exhibit 2 and the City of Jacksonville. The City finds that the direct contracts approved herein are justified because the entities are nonprofit organizations which do not typically qualify to participate in the Public Services Grant process. Likewise, as to the training component that will be provided to the nonprofit organizations, the City finds that the Nonprofit Center of Northeast Florida, Inc. is

uniquely positioned to provide these organizations with training and budgeting guidance to ensure their successful completion of the grant agreement requirements, thus justifying this direct appropriation.

Waiver of Section 118.201(f)(7) Section 7. (Release of Appropriations), Ordinance Code. Section 118.201(f)(7) (Release of Appropriations), Chapter 118 (City Grants), Ordinance Code, is hereby waived as to the disbursement of funds based upon draws for services performed or reimbursements for work done. Waiver of Section 118.201(f)(7), Ordinance Code, is requested to allow advance payments in excess of 10% to the entities referenced in Revised Exhibit 2. These entities will receive advance payment of 50% of the total award to be paid for start-up costs with the remainder of the grant paid upon completion of the project, consistent with the provisions of the grant agreement attached hereto as Revised Exhibit 3. Waiver of Section 118.201(f)(7), Ordinance Code, is also requested to allow advance payments in excess of 10% to the Nonprofit Center of Northeast The Nonprofit Center of Northeast Florida, Inc. will Florida, Inc. receive advance payment of \$3,000 to be paid for initial training with the remainder of the appropriation paid upon completion of the project, consistent with the provisions of the agreement referenced in Section 4 above.

Section 8. Oversight Department. The Office of Grants and Contract Compliance of the Finance and Administration Department, in conjunction with the Neighborhoods Department, shall oversee the project described herein.

Section 9. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
