A RESOLUTION HONORING AND COMMENDING THE LIFE
AND ACCOMPLISHMENTS OF APOSTLE DR. GENTLE L.
GROOVER, SR.; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Apostle Dr. Gentle L. Groover, Sr., a native of Greenville, Florida, served two years in the U.S. Army and earned an associate's degree from North Florida Junior College before pursuing divinity studies at the University of Alabama. He was later conferred an honorary Doctor of Divinity degree from the St. Thomas Christian University; and

WHEREAS, in 1963 Dr. Groover moved to Jacksonville where he established a mission church on the city's Northside that, after several relocations due to a growing congregation, would eventually become the Greater Refuge Temple on Rowe Avenue at Lem Turner Road. In 1983 Pastor Groover was consecrated a Bishop in the Church of Our Lord Jesus Christ, and international denomination with over 1,200 churches in the United States and in 22 foreign countries, and in 1984 was elected an Apostle and member of the governing body of the church; and

WHEREAS, Apostle Groover and his sister, Catherine Hester McNair, founded Bridge the Gap in 1981, a program intended to help meet the needs of the residents of the City's Northside. Among the numerous programs sponsored by Bridge the Gap are the annual Law Enforcement and Fire/Rescue Thanksgiving Day, the annual Gift Giving Day providing food, clothing, and toys to families in need during the holiday season, an annual Walk for Wellness co-sponsored with St. Vincent's Medical Center to encourage an active and healthy lifestyle,

a Youth Program reinforcing self-esteem and discipline through karate and self-defense classes, and an Adopt a Grandparent program; and

WHEREAS, Apostle Groover has been active in numerous efforts to improve the Jacksonville community at large, serving on the Springfield Ministerial Alliance and participating in multidenominational efforts pursuing justice, equity, safety, and quality of life issues. As a result of his decades of service to the community, he was awarded a ceremonial key to the city in 2003 by Mayor John Peyton. In 2018 he established the Gentle and Vivian Groover Endowment for Children's Health, the funds from which assist Baptist Health in the operation of the Ribault High School Medical Clinic; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Groover has carried out his ministry in a variety of ways over the course of six decades, from being an inspirational preacher and counselor to spreading his ministry on radio and television, and from overseeing his denomination's missionary work around the world to organizing deliveries of food, clothing and other necessities to the victims of disasters in the United States such as Hurricanes Hugo, Andrew and Katrina; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. The City Council hereby honors and commends the life and accomplishments of Apostle Dr. Gentle Groover, Sr. of the Greater Refuge Temple over the course of a long and productive life and wishes him the very best of health and happiness in the years to come. His life of selfless devotion to the care and inspiration of others is a testament to his faith and an example of true servant leadership.
