ΑN ORDINANCE CONCERNING SURPLUS PERSONAL PROPERTY OF THE CITY; DECLARING THAT CERTAIN 2015 CHEVROLET 3500HD 6.0L V8 HORTON RESCUE UNIT (VIN 1GB3CZCG1FF180231, VEHICLE NUMBER 3526-30) VALUED AT APPROXIMATELY \$7,000 AND THAT CERTAIN 2004 PIERCE DASH PUMPER CAT C-12 IN6 FIRE TRUCK (VIN 4P1CD01W54A004380 15833, VEHICLE NUMBER 3355-10) VALUED AT APPROXIMATELY \$4,000 TO BE SURPLUS TO THE NEEDS OF THE CITY AND AUTHORIZING THE APPROPRIATE OFFICIALS OF THE CITY TO TRANSFER TITLE OF SAID PROPERTY TO THE FORT MYERS BEACH FIRE CONTROL DISTRICT, LOCATED AT 100 VOORHIS STREET, FORT MYERS BEACH, FLORIDA 33931, FOR USE IN THE PROVISION OF EMERGENCY SERVICES IN THE FORT MYERS BEACH FIRE CONTROL DISTRICT, AT NO COST, IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 122.812(C), ORDINANCE CODE; DESIGNATING THE JACKSONVILLE FIRE AND RESCUE DEPARTMENT MONITOR ACTUAL USE OF SAID PROPERTY; PROVIDING FOR A REVERTER; REQUESTING EMERGENCY PASSAGE UPON INTRODUCTION; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville: Section 1. Declaration of Surplus. The City hereby declares that certain 2015 Chevrolet 3500HD 6.0L V8 Horton Rescue Unit (VIN 1GB3CZCG1FF180231, vehicle number 3526-30) valued at approximately \$7,000 and that certain 2004 Pierce Dash Pumper CAT C-12 IN6 Fire Truck (VIN 4P1CD01W54A004380 15833, vehicle number 3355-10) valued at approximately \$4,000 (collectively, the "Subject Property"), to be surplus to the needs of the City of Jacksonville and authorizes the appropriate City officials to transfer title of the Subject Property to the Fort Myers Beach Fire Control District, located at 100 Voorhis Street, Fort Myers Beach, Florida 33931, at no cost, pursuant to Section 122.812(c), Ordinance Code. A copy of the certificate from the Chief of Procurement certifying compliance with provisions of Chapter 122, Ordinance Code, is attached hereto Revised Exhibit 1, labeled as "Revised Exhibit Certification, October 25, 2022 - Floor", and incorporated herein by this reference. Copies of the property transfer forms are attached hereto as Exhibit 2.

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Section 2. Public Purpose. The surplus vehicles are needed by the Fort Myers Beach Fire Control District to rebuild their emergency services fleet after loss of their fire and rescue vehicles during Hurricane Ian. The City of Jacksonville finds that providing these surplussed vehicles to the Fort Myers Beach Fire Control District to be used for the provision of critical emergency services for the Fort Myers Beach community is a valid public purpose.

Section 3. Jacksonville Fire and Rescue Department to Monitor Actual Use of Subject Property. The Jacksonville Fire and Rescue Department will be the designated agency to monitor the Fort Myers Beach Fire Control District's use of the Subject Property in accordance with the purposes set forth herein.

Section 4. Reverter. The disposition authorized herein is conditioned upon the Fort Myers Beach Fire Control District using the said vehicles for the purposes set forth herein and is conditioned

upon the Fort Myers Beach Fire Control District's agreeing to convey and physically return the vehicles back to the City of Jacksonville, at no cost to the City of Jacksonville, in the event that the vehicles are not used for those purposes.

Section 5. Requesting Emergency Passage Upon Introduction Pursuant to Council Rule 4.901 Emergency. Emergency passage upon introduction of this legislation is requested. The nature of the emergency is that the Fort Myers Beach Fire Control District has an immediate need to restore critical emergency services in Fort Myers Beach community. The Fort Myers Beach Fire Control District has requested donation of fire and rescue vehicles to help rebuild their emergency services fleet after experiencing the devastating loss of much of their own fleet during Hurricane Ian.

Section 6. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
