Bill Summary: This bill confirms the Mayor's reappointment of Gigi Ackerman to the Art in Public Places Committee, as a lay citizen representing Planning District No. 5, for a first full term to expire on December 31, 2025.

Background Information: The Art in Public Places Committee is established pursuant to Chapter 126, *Ordinance Code*, and charged to choose art which is compatible with and which will enhance the architecture and general environment of the City; responsible for receiving, reviewing and acting on the recommendations of the Art Selection Panels; seek to ensure that at least 15% of the artists selected for purchase or commission will be resident(s) in the Greater Jacksonville area (Duval, St. Johns, Nassau, Clay and Baker Counties); will also encourage the selection of regional artists e.g. Florida and the Southeastern United States. Section 126.903, *Ordinance Code*, provides that the members of the committee are appointed by the Mayor, with six of the members representing the community at large, each residing within a different planning district.

Ms. Ackerman is currently the Director of Revenue & Strategic Development at the Ackerman Cancer Center. She earned her Master of Business Administration degree from Tulane University in 2016. Ms. Ackerman is a Duval County resident and resides within Council District 14, Planning District 5.

Policy Impact Area: Art in Public Places Committee operations

Attendance: Ms. Ackerman attendance record is 86%, she attended 6 of 7 meetings during her term from 8/24/21 to 12/31/22.
