On September 28th the fierce hurricane made landfall in southwest 16 17 Florida as a category 4 storm, with winds over 150 miles per hour and 18 catastrophic damage from extreme storm surge and rainfall; and 19 WHEREAS, Hurricane Ian tragically took the lives of more than 20 one hundred residents, annihilated homes, roadways and bridges, left 21 hundreds of thousands without electricity, and stranded many people

22 in their neighborhoods or on their rooftops when roads were rendered 23 impassable; and

WHEREAS, numerous first responders mobilized to help those who faced the brunt of the storm, including Jacksonville Fire and Rescue officers and employees who went to assist and coordinate with the search and rescue crews in some of the hardest-hit communities; and

28 WHEREAS, thousands of people have been saved from the rubble in 29 the days since the hurricane, and rescue crews are still hard at work 30 in the aftermath of the storm under dire conditions including flooded 31 roadways, crumbled bridges, and a lack of water, food and electricity; 1 now therefore

**BE IT RESOLVED** by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

**Section 1.** The City of Jacksonville hereby commends the officers and employees from the Jacksonville Fire and Rescue Department for their heroic rescue endeavors in the aftermath of Hurricane Ian in Southwest Florida. Jacksonville City Council extends appreciation to all the parties involved in the recovery activities following this disastrous storm, and expresses condolences to all of those experiencing loss from this dreadful hurricane.

Section 2. Effective Date. This Resolution shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
