Appropriation. For the 2022-2023 fiscal year, 8 within the City's budget, there is hereby appropriated the indicated 9 sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) 10 listed in subsection (b): (B.T. 23-013 attached hereto as **Exhibit 1** and incorporated herein by 11 12 this reference) 13 (a) Appropriated from: See B.T. 23-013 \$840,160.00 14 15 (b) Appropriated to: See B.T. 23-013 \$840,160.00 16 17 (c) Explanation of Appropriation: The funding above represents an appropriation of \$840,160 18 from the Special Law Enforcement Trust Fund (the "Fund") 19 20 to procure contractual services and equipment and includes 21 transfers of Fund dollars to other City funds for various 22 crime prevention and law enforcement expenditures and 23 activities in accordance with the Ordinance Code and 24 Section 932.7055, Florida Statutes, as more specifically 25 outlined herein. 26 Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in 27 Section 1 is to transfer \$12,500 from the Fund to the Teen Driver 2.8 Special Revenue Fund for the Teen Driver Challenge Program in 29 accordance with Section 111.365, Ordinance Code, to transfer \$7,500 30 from the Fund to the Police Explorers Trust Fund for the Jacksonville

Sheriff's Office Police Explorer Post in accordance with Section

111.340, Ordinance Code, and to transfer \$275,000 to the Mental Health 1 Offender Program Trust Fund to pay for contractual services from I.M. 2 Sulzbacher Center for the Homeless, Inc. to operate a jail diversion 3 program for mentally ill offenders. In addition, this appropriation 4 5 includes \$70,160 from the Fund to reimburse the General Fund for forfeiture-related expenditures in accordance 6 with Section 7 932.7055(4)(c), Florida Statutes, \$225,000 to procure tactical body armor for the Jacksonville Sheriff's Office (JSO) SWAT units, and 8 9 \$250,000 for the Haines Street Property Facility - Firearms Laboratory 10 Renovation project (the "Project"). The Project entails expansion of the Firearms Laboratory which provides ballistic testing to support 11 12 JSO investigations. The expansion will reduce the backlog of items waiting for ballistic testing that has occurred due to a 56% increase 13 in test fires since 2018. A Certification from the Jacksonville 14 15 Sheriff's Office that this appropriation from the Special Law Enforcement Trust Fund complies with Section 932.7055, Florida 16 17 Statutes, is attached hereto as **Exhibit 2** and incorporated herein by this reference. 18

19 Section 3. Capital Improvement Plan Amendment. Ordinance 20 2022-505-E, adopting the 2023-2027 Five-Year Capital Improvement Plan 21 (the "CIP") for the City and certain of its independent agencies, is 22 hereby amended to include the Project in the CIP and to reflect funding for the Project in fiscal year 2022-2023 as more fully 23 24 described in the Project Information Sheet attached hereto as Exhibit 3 and incorporated herein by this reference. The City Council finds 25 26 that the deferral of this amendment of the CIP until the next annual budget and CIP review will be detrimental to the best interests of 27 28 the community because such deferral will unnecessarily delay 29 completion of the Project leading to additional backlog in items waiting for ballistic testing. 30

Pursuant to Section 122.605(c), Ordinance Code, enactment of

this Ordinance requires the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the City Council members present at the meeting because of the CIP amendment set forth in this section. This Ordinance shall constitute an amendment to Ordinance 2022-505-E. In all other respects, the Five-Year Capital Improvement Plan approved by Ordinance 2022-505-E shall remain unchanged and continue in full force and effect.

7 Section 4. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become 8 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective 9 without the Mayor's signature.
