5 AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$261,904 FROM THE OPIOID SETTLEMENT SPECIAL REVENUE FUND TO PAY 6 7 FOR PERSONNEL COSTS AND EQUIPMENT FOR THE 8 MANAGER OF OPIOID ABATEMENT AND PROGRAM 9 COORDINATOR - OPIOID ABATEMENT POSITIONS AUTHORIZED HEREIN, AS INITIATED BY B.T. 23-022; 10 APPROVING POSITIONS, AS INITIATED BY R.C. 23-11 039; CREATING A NEW SECTION 111.265 (OPIOID 12 13 SETTLEMENT SPECIAL REVENUE FUND), PART 2 (HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES), CHAPTER 111 (SPECIAL 14 15 REVENUE AND TRUST ACCOUNTS), ORDINANCE CODE, TO ESTABLISH A PERMANENT SPECIAL REVENUE FUND INTO 16 WHICH WILL BE DEPOSITED ALL OPIOID SETTLEMENT 17 18 PROCEEDS RECEIVED PURSUANT TO THE FLORIDA MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING AUTHORIZED BY 19 ORDINANCE 2021-659-E; PROVIDING FOR 20 21 CODIFICATION INSTRUCTIONS; APPROVING AND 22 AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, OR HIS DESIGNEE, AND THE 23 CORPORATION SECRETARY TO EXECUTE AND DELIVER, FOR AND ON BEHALF OF THE CITY, THE INTERLOCAL 24 25 AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE, THE CITY OF ATLANTIC BEACH, THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE 26 BEACH, THE CITY OF NEPTUNE BEACH, AND THE TOWN 27 OF BALDWIN FOR DISTRIBUTION OF OPIOID LITIGATION 28 29 SETTLEMENT PROCEEDS; PROVIDING FOR OVERSIGHT BY 30 THE JACKSONVILLE FIRE AND RESCUE DEPARTMENT; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE. 31

WHEREAS, the City of Jacksonville, as well as the entire state of Florida, has suffered harm from the opioid epidemic; and

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WHEREAS, the City of Jacksonville has entered into the Florida Memorandum of Understanding with the state of Florida (the "MOU") as authorized by Ordinance 2021-659-E, which sets forth the framework of a unified plan for the proposed allocation and use of opioid settlement proceeds received in accordance with the MOU (the "Opioid Settlement Proceeds"); and

10 WHEREAS, the City of Jacksonville has agreed to a plan for 11 distribution of a portion of the Opioid Settlement Proceeds to the 12 cities of Jacksonville Beach, Atlantic Beach, Neptune Beach and the 13 Town of Baldwin pursuant to an Interlocal Agreement as more 14 particularly described herein; and

WHEREAS, the Opioid Settlement Proceeds shall be deposited in the appropriate accounting string within the Opioid Settlement Special Revenue Fund 15111 created hereby for subsequent Council appropriation in accordance with the requirements of the Fund, to pay for various projects and programs as authorized by the MOU and for distribution to the Beaches and Baldwin as outlined in the Interlocal Agreement; now therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

23 Section 1. Appropriation. For the 2022-2023 fiscal year, 24 within the City's budget, there is hereby appropriated the indicated 25 sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) 26 listed in subsection (b):

(c) Explanation of Appropriation:

The funding above represents an appropriation of \$261,904 from the Opioid Settmenet Special Revenue Fund to pay for equipment and for the salaries and benefits of the new Manager of Opioid Abatement and Program Coordinator -Opioid Abatement positions authorized herein.

The purpose of the appropriation in 8 Section 2. Purpose. 9 Section 1 is to fund the salaries and benefits of the Manager of 10 Opioid Abatement and the Program Coordinator - Opioid Abatement positions who will be responsible to oversee and administer the Opioid 11 12 Abatement Program. In addition, funds will be used to supply these with computers, wireless communication 13 positions and mobile 14 equipment, and other specialized equipment. These positions will be 15 housed in the Jacksonville Fire and Rescue Department.

16 Section 3. Approval of Positions. There are hereby 17 approved the positions more fully described in R.C. 23-039, attached 18 hereto as Exhibit 2 and incorporated herein by this reference.

19 Section 4. Creating Section 111.265 а new (Opioid 20 Settlement Special Revenue Fund), Part 2 (Health and Human Services), 21 Chapter 111 (Special Revenue and Trust Accounts), Ordinance Code. A 22 new Section 111.265 (Opioid Settlement Special Revenue Fund), Part 2 23 (Health and Human Services), Chapter 111 (Special Revenue and Trust 24 Accounts), Ordinance Code, is hereby created to read as follows:

SPECIAL REVENUE AND TRUST ACCOUNTS

HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES

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Sec. 111.265. - Opioid Settlement Special Revenue Fund.

CHAPTER 111.

PART 2.

30 There is hereby created within the General Government - Budgeted 31 Fund a special revenue fund account to be known as the *Opioid*

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Settlement Special Revenue Fund (the "Fund") into which the City 1 shall deposit all opioid settlement proceeds received in accordance 2 3 with the terms of the Florida Memorandum of Understanding authorized and approved by Ordinance 2021-659-E (the "MOU") to which the City 4 5 is a party. All sums placed into the Fund, together with any interest accrued thereon, shall only be used for the "Approved Purposes" 6 7 defined and outlined in the MOU. The monies deposited in the Fund shall not lapse at the close of any fiscal year but shall carry over 8 9 to the next fiscal year and shall be subject to appropriation by the 10 Council in accordance with the terms of the MOU with the exception that funds disbursed to the cities of Jacksonville Beach, Atlantic 11 Beach, Neptune Beach and the Town of Baldwin in accordance with the 12 Interlocal Agreement between the City of Jacksonville, the City of 13 Atlantic Beach, the City of Jacksonville Beach, the City of Neptune 14 15 Beach, and the Town of Baldwin for Distribution of Opioid Litigation Settlement Proceeds (the "Interlocal Agreement") approved by 16 Ordinance 2022- -E shall be self-appropriating. 17

Codification Instructions. The Codifier and the Section 5. 18 Office of General Counsel are authorized to make all chapter and 19 20 division "table of contents" consistent with the changes set forth 21 herein, including renumbering of sections. Such editorial changes 22 and any other changes necessary to make the Ordinance Code consistent 23 with the intent of this legislation are approved and directed herein, 24 and the changes to the Ordinance Code shall be made forthwith and 25 when inconsistencies are discovered.

Section 6. Approval and Authorization. There is hereby approved, and the Mayor, or his designee, and the Corporation Secretary are hereby authorized to execute and deliver, for and on behalf of the City, the Interlocal Agreement Between the City of Jacksonville, the City of Atlantic Beach, the City of Jacksonville Beach, the City of Neptune Beach, and the Town of Baldwin for

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Distribution of Opioid Litigation Settlement Proceeds (the "Interlocal Agreement") attached hereto as **Exhibit 3** and incorporated herein by this reference.

Section 7. Oversight. The Jacksonville Fire and Rescue
Department shall provide oversight of the Interlocal Agreement and
positions authorized and more fully described herein.

7 Section 8. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become
8 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective
9 without the Mayor's signature.
