## RESOLUTION 2022-799-A

A RESOLUTION HONORING AND COMMENDING NINA WATERS ON HER YEARS OF SERVICE TO THE JACKSONVILLE COMMUNITY AS SHE ANNOUNCES HER RETIREMENT FROM THE PRESIDENCY OF THE COMMUNITY FOUNDATION FOR NORTHEAST FLORIDA; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Nina Waters, a native of Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, came to Jacksonville in 1976 to attend Jacksonville University and built impressive professional career in the city following her graduation; and

WHEREAS, from 1989 to 2001 Ms. Waters was Executive Director of the PACE Center for Girls Jacksonville, where she completed a \$2.5 million capital campaign, assisted in the oversight of construction of a new 20,000 square foot facility and facilitated the relocation of the program to the Thompson-Weaver campus on University Boulevard North; and

WHEREAS, following her success at the PACE Center, Nina Waters joined the staff at the Community Foundation for Northeast Florida, Florida's oldest and largest community foundation, as Executive Vice President. After three years she was named President of the foundation and has served the organization splendidly in that capacity for nearly 18 years; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Waters' accomplishments at the Community Foundation are numerous and substantial. She launched the Quality Education for All initiative in 2005, which led to the creation of the Jacksonville

Public Education Fund and culminated in the announcement of a \$50 million fund for local education investment. She also assisted in the development of the Women's Giving Alliance, the Foundation's first giving circle, the LGBTQ Community Fund for Northeast Florida and the A. L. Lewis Black Opportunity & Impact Fund. The Community Foundation's assets have grown more than ten-fold during her presidency and annual grants to the community have increased five-fold in that time, to more than \$43 million in 2021; and

WHEREAS, Nina Waters has also been deeply involved philanthropy, education, and community improvement in a variety of other ways. A small sampling of her volunteerism and leadership positions include membership on the governing boards of of Jacksonville Chamber Commerce, the Nemours Foundation, Jacksonville University and the JU Public Policy Institute, the Jacksonville Civic Council, the Uptown Civitan Club and the Women's Giving Alliance Steering Committee. She is a Past Chair of the Southeastern Council of Foundations and had been a board member of the National Center for Family Philanthropy, the Philanthropic Network and Past-President of Community Foundations of Florida; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Waters' outstanding work has been recognized by numerous organizations. A very brief listing of her awards includes induction into the First Coast Hall of Fame, the Florida Times-Union EVE Award for Employment, The OneJax Institute Humanitarian Award, the Jacksonville University Distinguished Alumni Award, the Nonprofit Center of Northeast Florida Sector Advocate Award, the Gateway Girl Scout Council Woman of Distinction Award and the Prudential Foundation Leadership Award; and

WHEREAS, Nina Waters has recently announced her intention to retire from the Presidency of the Community Foundation in 2023 after a long and distinguished career; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. The City Council hereby honors and commends Nina Waters on her many years of service to the Jacksonville community as she prepares to retire from the Presidency of the Community Foundation for Northeast Florida. Ms. Waters' decades of service to our city and region are the consummate example of servant leadership, and the City Council expresses its tremendous gratitude for her leadership, inspiration, and foresight in making Jacksonville and Northeast Florida the best community it can be for all its citizens.

Section 2. Effective Date. This Resolution shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
