\$1,069,280.01 Urban Search and Rescue Grant awarded by the

State of Florida, Division of Emergency Management, through

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its Fiscal Year 2022 Urban Search and Rescue Sustainment Program. The Jacksonville Fire and Rescue Department (JFRD) will use the funds to purchase vehicles, capital equipment and supplies for the Urban Search and Rescue Task Forces (the "Task Forces"). The grant period of performance commenced July 1, 2022 and ends June 30, 2023. No local match is required.

Section 2. The purpose of the appropriation in Purpose. Section 1 is to provide grant funding from the State of Florida, Division of Emergency Management, to procure capital equipment, supplies and vehicles for the Task Forces including, but not limited to, an International 4-door Tractor, Command Vehicles (Tahoe or similar), F350 and F450 Crew Cab Pickup Trucks, Kubota 4 passenger utility vehicles, Featherlite flatbed dual-axel trailers, a pneumatic compressor, and field repairable dry suits. This equipment will help to ensure the Task Forces are maintained in a constant state of readiness with the ability to immediately respond to any disaster, whether natural or manmade. Each Task Force must maintain lifesaving equipment and this grant funding will ensure it is up to date and complete. A copy of the State-Funded Grant Agreement Urban Search and Rescue Grant (Agreement Number: T0230) providing the terms and conditions relative to receipt and expenditure of the grant funds has been placed On File with the Office of Legislative Services.

Section 3. Oversight. The Jacksonville Fire and Rescue Department, Emergency Preparedness Division, shall oversee administration of the grant described herein.

Section 4. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
