AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$7,000,000.00 FROM THE TREE PROTECTION AND RELATED EXPENSES TRUST FUND, FUND 15304, TO THE "630-CITY TREE PLANTING PROGRAM," "REMOVE AND REPLACE TREE PLANTING PROGRAM," AND "LEVEL 3 TREE PLANTING PROGRAM," TO PROVIDE TREE PLANTING ADMINISTERED BY PUBLIC WORKS ON PUBLIC PROPERTY; APPROVING THE REVISED TREE PLANTING PROGRAM (LEVEL 3) AGREEMENT; APPROVING, AND REQUESTING THE MAYOR, OR HIS DESIGNEE, TO DIRECT THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS TO CONTINUE TO ADMINISTER THE PROGRAMS IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE CRITERIA HEREIN PROVIDED; PROVIDING A CARRYOVER OF FUNDS INTO SUBSEQUENT FISCAL YEARS; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Jacksonville Tree Commission voted on September 21, 2022 to recommend increasing the funding for the 630-CITY Tree Planting Program, the Remove and Replace Program (also known as the "County-Wide Tree Planting Program-Right of Way"), and the Level 3 Tree Planting Program, (the "Programs") by \$7,000,000.00; and

WHEREAS, the Jacksonville Tree Commission has reviewed, discussed and approved the revised and updated Tree Planting Program (Level 3) Agreement, attached hereto as Revised Exhibit 2; now therefore

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Appropriation for the 630-CITY Tree Planting

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Program, the Remove and Replace Program (also and formerly known as the "County- Wide Tree Planting Program-Right of Way"), and the Level 3 Tree Planting Program. For the 2022-2023 fiscal year, within the City's budget, there are hereby appropriated the indicated sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) listed in subsection (b):

(The account information is attached hereto as **Revised Exhibit 1**, labeled as "Rev Exhibit 1, Rev B.T., November 14, 2022 - NCSPHS" and incorporated herein by this reference)

- (c) Explanation of the appropriation The funding above is to provide funding from the Tree Protection and Related Expenses Trust Fund, Fund 15304, for the following Programs and amounts:
 - \$2,000,000.00 for the 630-CITY Tree Planting Program;
 - \$4,000,000.00 for the Remove and Replace Program; and
 - \$1,000,000.00 for the Level 3 Tree Planting Program;

All Programs are to be administered by the Department of Public Works.

Section 2. Purpose of the three (3) appropriations.

- (1) The purpose of the \$2,000,000.00 appropriation in Section 1 is to provide funds the Tree Protection and Related Expenses Trust Fund for Public Works to plant trees on public property in Duval County in locations where adjacent property owners have requested trees by calling (904) 630-CITY; The Program funds will be expended in this way:
- (a) When a property owner enlists the help of the City through "630-CITY" asking for a new tree or trees to be installed on public property, the Department of Public Works, Mowing and Landscape

Maintenance Division, will work with the property owner to determine what species of tree, if any, is appropriate for the locations suggested by the property owner. The location and species must be approved by a City Arborist, City Urban Forester, or City Landscape Architect, who will use the concept of "Right Tree, Right Place"; and

- (b) If a tree or trees are appropriate based upon the request, the Division staff will counsel the property owner about the necessity for maintaining the tree(s) through proper irrigation, fertilization, and pruning.
- (c) The Department of Public Works may use the funds set aside for this Program within Fund 15304 to install trees approved in accordance with the "Tree Commission Approved Tree Planting List," which is available for view on the Tree Commission's website.
- (2) The Purpose of the \$4,000,000.00 appropriation in Section 1 is to provide funds from the Tree Protection and Related Expenses Trust Fund for Public Works to plant trees for the Remove and Replace Program, also known as the "City-Wide Tree Program-Right of Way" to plant trees within public rights-of-way and parks in Duval County. The Program funds will be expended in this way: When a tree with the public right-of-way or park is damaged, dead, in impending decline, or becomes a hazard to the public health, safety and welfare, the Department of Public Works may use Fund 15304 to remove and replace said tree, so long as:
 - (a) The tree removed is replaced within six (6) months.
- (b) The species of replacement tree is contained in the "Tree commission Approved Tree Planting List", as amended from time to time, and approved by a City Arborist.
- (c) The location of the replacement tree is approved by a City Arborist and is in close proximity to the tree removed. "Close proximity" is defined as follows:
 - (I) As to replacement trees in rights-of-way, within

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the right-of-way of the parcel abutting the tree removal site, or in the right-of-way of an adjacent parcel abutting, or across the street from, the tree removal site, but in no instance shall the location of the replacement tree be more than 100 feet away from the tree that was removed.

- (II) As to replacement trees within parks, no more than 100 feet from the tree removed.
- (3) The purpose of the \$1,000,000.00 appropriation in Section 1 is to provide funds from the Tree Protection and Related Expenses Trust Fund for entities that have applied for Level 3 Tree Planting Program funding to provide the design, coordination, purchase, installation and guarantee of a tree planting project on public property within Duval County. The process for administering the Level 3 Program shall be the following:
- (a) The Level 3 Program applications may be completed by the applicant after notification to the District Council Member, and all At Large Council Members, and a preliminary meeting with the Public Works Arborist and related staff to discuss the goals and objectives of the project. The current Level 3 Application and Application Instructions are available online on the Tree Commission's website which may be found on the Department of Public Works website, City of Jacksonville, and may be changed in format, but in general will be in keeping with the process outlined in this legislation.
- (b) Completed applications are provided to the Public Works Arborist and related staff who then prepare a staff report regarding the project for use by the District Council Member and the At Large Council Members, and the Tree Commission in their advisory recommendation to the Mayor's Budget Review Committee ("MBRC").
- (c) The Tree Commission reviews the proposed project at a Tree Commission public meeting and recommends either approval,

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approval with conditions, or denial of the project to MBRC.

- (d) Public Works then prepares the documents necessary to communicate to MBRC the Tree Commission's recommendation as well as the original submission by the applicant.
- If MBRC approves the project or approves it with amendments as provided by the Tree Commission, the Office of General Counsel will prepare the Agreement, as updated herein, between the City and the applicant for execution by the parties.
- The Public Works Arborist and related staff shall coordinate with the applicant regarding bid documents and bid reviews for the subcontractor that will purchase the material and install the project.
- The Public Works Arborist and related staff will assure that the project is completed pursuant to the Agreement.
- Section 3. Approving the Revised Tree Planting Program (Level 3) Agreement. The revised and updated Tree Planting Program (Level 3) Agreement (the "Agreement"), attached hereto as Revised Exhibit 2 and incorporated herein by this reference, is hereby Agreement provides terms and conditions approved. The for disbursement of Level 3 Tree Planting Program funds to qualified applicants seeking funds for approved Level 3 tree planting projects.
- Section 4. Oversight Department. The Department shall continue to oversee the Programs described herein. The trees that are planted, and any that are removed as part of the planting, shall be recorded electronically on Plan-it Geo, or its equivalent, and shall note the species and size of each, as well as the date of planting or removal.
- Section 5. Carryover. The funds appropriated in this ordinance shall not lapse but shall carryover to subsequent fiscal years.
 - Section 6. **Effective Date.** This ordinance shall become

effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective 2 without the Mayor's signature. 3 Form Approved:
