ORDINANCE 2022-718-E

AN ORDINANCE REGARDING CHAPTER 745 (ADDRESSING AND STREET NAMING REGULATIONS) ORDINANCE CODE; ESTABLISHING AN HONORARY STREET DESIGNATION AND ASSOCIATED ROADWAY MARKERS FOR APOSTLE GENTLE L. GROOVER, SR.; ESTABLISHING AN HONORARY STREET DESIGNATION ON ROWE AVENUE EXTENDING FROM LEM TURNER ROAD TO MONCRIEF ROAD IN COUNCIL DISTRICT 8 FOR APOSTLE DR. GENTLE L. GROOVER, SR.; PROVIDING FOR THE INSTALLATION OF TWO HONORARY ROADWAY MARKERS TO BE LOCATED APPROPRIATE LOCATIONS ON THE DESIGNATED ROAD IN COUNCIL DISTRICT 8; WAIVER OF SECTION 745.105 (I)(2) WHICH REQUIRES THAT THE HONOREE BE DECEASED FOR AT LEAST FIVE YEARS; WAIVER OF SECTION 745.105 (I) (3) WHICH REQUIRES THAT THE HONOREE LIVE IN THE COMMUNITY WITHIN FIVE MILES OF THE STREET BEING DESIGNATED FOR AT LEAST 10 DIRECTING THELEGISLATIVE SERVICES YEARS; DIVISION TO FORWARD THIS ORDINANCE TO PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT, ADDRESSING DIVISION FOR PROCESSING, IMPLEMENTATION AND COORDINATION WITH THE PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT, TRAFFIC ENGINEERING AND OTHER AFFECTED AGENCIES AND ORGANIZATIONS; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Apostle Dr. Gentle L. Groover, Sr., was known for his "gentle" spirit, and a gift for motivational speeches; and

WHEREAS, during the early 1950s, Apostle Groover served in the United States Army until his honorable discharge; and

WHEREAS, in 1963, Apostle Groover moved to Jacksonville to start a mission church, initially, on Cord Avenue; and

WHEREAS, over the years, and anticipating numerous building locations for the church, Apostle Groover eventually settled at 1317 Rowe Avenue for the church location; and

WHEREAS, Greater Refuge Temple has been located at 1317 Rowe Avenue for the past 24 years, and Apostle Groover served as the lead minister from the beginning; and

WHEREAS, through his motivation of others, Apostle Groover made a positive impact on the Jacksonville community; and

WHEREAS, in 1981, Mr. Groover, along with his sister, Catherine Hester McNair established Bridge The Gap, Inc., to serve the community with several notable programs such as: the Annual Law Enforcement and Fire/Rescue Thanksgiving Day, the Annual Gift Giving Day, the Annual Walk for Wellness, The Youth Program, and the Adopt-a-Grandparent Program which was established in 1983 to provide support and companionship to Jacksonville senior citizens; and

WHEREAS, Bridge the Gap, Inc., is still in existence today operating a successful community program by partnership with UF Health, Florida Blue, First Coast Black Nurses Association, City of Jacksonville Parks and Recreation, Winn Dixie, Jacksonville Housing Authority, and Feeding Northeast Florida among others; and

WHEREAS, Pastor Groover became a Bishop in 1983, and was appointed to serve over 1,200 church organizations nationwide and in 22 countries including Mexico, Canada, Haiti, England, and the Philippines; and

WHEREAS, in 1984, Bishop Groover was elected as an Apostle,

which is a part of the highest governing body of his church organization, and 10 years later, in 1995, was elected as the Presiding Prelate which bestowed leadership to him over hundreds of churches; and

WHEREAS, during Groover's leadership, the church experienced a significant increase in membership all due to his novel initiatives, ideas, and programs for senior and youth members; and

WHEREAS, in June of 1988, former Governor Lawton Chiles, lauded Pastor Groover at the dedication of the sanctuary of Greater Refuge Temple on Rowe Avenue; and

WHEREAS, Pastor Groover also lead the ministry services at the Lakeland Florida church location, and from 2015-2019, Lakeland Mayor Bill Mutz acknowledged Pastor Groover for his diligent work and philanthropy in the Lakeland community; and

WHEREAS, internationally, Apostle Groover mentored, and guided other church pastors by building new churches and schools in Monrovia, Liberia, Ghana, West Africa, and Hyderabad, India; and

WHEREAS, stateside, Pastor Groover was instrumental in obtaining and supplying much needed food during several hurricanes in South Carolina and Louisiana; and

WHEREAS, on a local level, Pastor Groover ministered sorrowing families at numerous Jacksonville hospitals as well as provided extended shelter to homeless individuals; and

WHEREAS, a man of humility and integrity, Apostle Dr. Groover dedicated almost 60 years in ministry, and lived to contribute to others; and

WHEREAS, in 2018, St. Thomas College bestowed an Honorary Doctor of Divinity to Mr. Groover; and

WHEREAS, also in 2018, Pastor Groover contributed, generously, to fund the establishment of the Ribault High School Medical Clinic; and

WHEREAS, Pastor Groover passed away in October 2022 after decades of service to the community; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 745.105 (j) (10), Ordinance Code, the Planning and Development Department mailed written notifications on July 11, 2022, and on August 11, 2022, to 65 affected property owners requesting the affected property owners to indicate their written consent or objection to the proposed honorary street designation. A copy of the first and second written notifications are attached hereto as Revised Exhibit 1, labeled as "Revised Exhibit 1, Rev 1st Notice, January 3, 2023 - NCSPHS" and Revised Exhibit 2, labeled as "Revised Exhibit 2, Rev 2nd Notice, January 3, 2023 -NCSPHS". Subsequently, nine additional affected property owners were identified, and written notifications were mailed to those owners on October 6, 2022 and November 6, 2022. A copy of the first and second written notifications to the additional affected property owners are attached as Exhibit 10 and Exhibit 11, respectively. A complete listing of the 74 total affected addresses is attached hereto as Revised Exhibit 3, labeled as "Revised Exhibit 3, Rev Address List, January 3, 2023 - NCSPHS"; and

WHEREAS, four (4) affected property owners that were initially notified indicated their consent of the proposed honorary designation. Copies of the written consents are attached as Revised Exhibit 4, labeled as "Revised Exhibit 4, Rev Consent Letters, January 3, 2023 - NCSPHS". Additionally, one (1) of the affected property owners who was subsequently notified indicated their consent of the proposed honorary designation. A copy of their written consent is attached hereto as Exhibit 12; and

WHEREAS, four (4) affected property owners indicated their objection to the proposed honorary designation. Copies of the written objections are attached as Exhibit 5; and

WHEREAS, fifteen (15) of the notification letters were "Returned

 to Sender," and "Unable to Forward." Copies of the envelopes are attached as **Exhibit 6**; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 745.105 (j)(10), Ord. Code, the remaining affected property owners are deemed to have consented to the proposed honorary designations due to their non-response to the written notifications; and

WHEREAS, the applicant remitted the required funds to satisfy the cost for the honorary markers. A payment receipt is attached as Exhibit 7. A completed application is also attached as Exhibit 8; now therefore

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Rowe Avenue to receive an honorary street designation for Apostle Dr. Gentle L. Groover, Sr. Rowe Avenue extending from Lem Turner Road to Moncrief Road in Council District 8, is hereby designated as contemplated by Section 745.105, Ordinance Code, for Apostle Dr. Gentle L. Groover, Sr. A map of the road designation is attached hereto as Exhibit 9.

Section 2. Honorary Roadside Markers for Apostle Dr. Gentle L. Groover, Sr. to be installed. Two honorary roadside markers, as contemplated by Section 745.105, Ordinance Code, recognizing and honoring Apostle Dr. Gentle L. Groover, Sr. shall be placed in appropriate locations on Rowe Avenue.

Section 3. Waiver of Section 745.105 (i) (2), Ordinance Code. Section 745.105(i) (2) which requires that the honoree be deceased for at least five years is hereby waived to honor Apostle Groover, who passed away in October 2022, for his contributions to the community.

Section 4. Waiver of Section 745.105 (i)(3), Ordinance Code. Section 745.105(i)(3) which requires that the honoree live in the community within five miles of the designated road for at least 10 years is hereby waived because Apostle Groover served as the lead

pastor at Greater Refuge Temple Church which is located on the designated road.

Section 5. Directing Legislative Services Division to forward a copy to the Planning and Development Department. The Chief of Legislative Services is requested to send a copy of this legislation, once enacted, to the Planning and Development Department, Addressing Unit, for processing, implementation, and coordination with the Public Works Department, Traffic Engineering Division and other affected agencies and organizations.

Section 6. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
