7 AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$391,472.29 PAID TO
8 THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE BY THE BOEING COMPANY
9 FOR THE PROVISION OF ADDITIONAL AIRCRAFT RESCUE
10 FIREFIGHTING (ARFF) SERVICES PROVIDED BY THE
11 JACKSONVILLE FIRE AND RESCUE DEPARTMENT FOR
12 AIRCRAFT OPERATIONS AT CECIL AIRPORT, AS
13 INITIATED BY REVISED B.T. 23-030; AUTHORIZING
14 POSITIONS, AS INITIATED BY R.C. 23-049;
15 APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, OR HIS
16 DESIGNEE, AND THE CORPORATION SECRETARY TO
17 EXECUTE AND DELIVER, FOR AND ON BEHALF OF THE
18 CITY, THE BOEING INDIRECT SUPPLY CHAIN FIXED
19 PRICE CONTRACT FORM BETWEEN THE CITY OF
20 JACKSONVILLE AND THE BOEING COMPANY PROVIDING
21 THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS FOR PROVISION OF ARFF
22 SERVICES AT CECIL AIRPORT; PROVIDING FOR
23 OVERSIGHT BY THE JACKSONVILLE FIRE AND RESCUE
24 DEPARTMENT; REQUESTING ONE CYCLE EMERGENCY
25 PASSAGE; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

27 **BE IT ORDAINED** by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

28 **Section 1. Appropriation.** For the 2022-2023 fiscal year,
29 within the City's budget, there is hereby appropriated the indicated
30 sum from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s)
31 listed in subsection (b):

3 incorporated herein by this reference):

8 (c) Explanation of Appropriation:

9 The funding above is an appropriation of \$391,472.29 paid
10 by The Boeing Company ("Boeing") to the City of
11 Jacksonville for the provision of additional Aircraft
12 Rescue Firefighting (ARFF) services provided by the
13 Jacksonville Fire and Rescue Department (JFRD) for aircraft
14 operations at Cecil Airport.

15 **Section 2. Purpose.** The purpose of the appropriation in
16 Section 1 is to receive revenue from The Boeing Company for the
17 provision of additional ARFF services and support at Cecil Airport.
18 JFRD has provided ARFF services to Boeing since the early 2000's.
19 Boeing recently notified JFRD of its intent to provide Cat 6 aircraft
20 operations at Cecil Airport and requested additional ARFF services
21 to support these operations which will be necessary due to the size
22 of aircraft that will frequently be flying into and out of the
23 facility. The Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) will require
24 greater levels of fire protection at Cecil Airport to accommodate
25 these types of planes. The Boeing Indirect Supply Chain Fixed Price
26 Contract Form (the "Agreement") authorized herein provides for JFRD
27 to make available three additional ARFF-trained JFRD personnel per
28 day to meet FAA requirements. JFRD currently has the necessary
29 equipment to provide these additional services but will require
30 authorization for nine additional full-time equivalent (FTE)
31 positions to maintain this service level.

1 **Section 3. Approval of Positions.** There are hereby
2 approved the positions more fully described in R.C. 23-049, attached
3 hereto as **Exhibit 2** and incorporated herein by this reference.

4 **Section 4. Approval and Authorization to Execute.** There is
5 hereby approved, and the Mayor, or his designee, and the Corporation
6 Secretary are hereby authorized to execute and deliver for and on
7 behalf of the City, the Boeing Indirect Supply Chain Fixed Price
8 Contract Form (the "Agreement"), in substantially the same form placed
9 **Revised On File** with the Legislative Services Division and
10 incorporated herein by this reference, between the City of
11 Jacksonville and The Boeing Company providing the terms and conditions
12 relative to the provision of ARFF services at Cecil Airport. The
13 Agreement may include such extensions, renewals, additions, deletions
14 and changes as may be reasonable, necessary and incidental for
15 carrying out the purposes thereof, as may be acceptable to the Mayor,
16 or his designee, with such inclusion and acceptance being evidenced
17 by execution of the Agreement by the Mayor or his designee; provided
18 however, no modifications to the Agreement may increase the financial
19 obligations or the liability of the City or decrease the duties and
20 obligations of Boeing and any such modification shall be technical
21 only and shall be subject to appropriate legal review and approval
22 by the Office of General Counsel. For the purposes of this Ordinance,
23 the term "technical changes" is defined as those changes having no
24 financial impact to the City and any other non-substantive changes
25 that do not substantively increase the duties and responsibilities
26 of the City under the provisions of the Agreement.

27 **Section 5. Oversight.** The Jacksonville Fire and Rescue
28 Department shall oversee the Agreement described herein.

29 **Section 6. Requesting One Cycle Emergency Passage Pursuant**
30 **to Council Rule 4.901 Emergency.** One cycle emergency passage of this
31 legislation is requested. The nature of the emergency is that Boeing

1 intends to begin flight operations with Cat 6 planes in February
2 2023. JFRD will need to onboard the additional personnel authorized
3 herein to meet FAA requirements for ARFF levels of service before
4 these larger aircraft are allowed to land at Cecil Airport.

5 **Section 7. Effective Date.** This Ordinance shall become
6 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective
7 without the Mayor's signature.
