S.O.S. Academy First Amendment Whitepaper

October 28, 2022

Background

S.O.C.K. Outstanding Students (S.O.S.) Academy, Inc. started offering education to middle school students as a charter school in 2001 at Mary Lena Gibbs Community Center. In 2012, Ordinance 2012-228 was approved providing authorization to execute a 10-year lease with three three-year renewal options. The renewal options are subject to approval by City Council.

The ordinance waived Section 126.202, Competitive Sealed Bid of Part 2 of the Procurement code allowing S.O.S. Academy to continue to offer a charter middle school at 6974 Wilson Boulevard. The wavier had been sought because S.O.S. Academy has been providing quality education to middle school students since 2001.

A S.O.S. Academy Special Revenue Fund, a permanent, ongoing special revenue fund of the City was authorized under this ordinance.

Parks, Recreation, and Community Services Department was designated as the Department that has oversight on the lease agreement and special revenue fund.

Recommended Action

The Parks, Recreation and Community Services Department (PRCS) respectfully request the execution an amendment for a renewal of an additional thirty (30) years, beginning on the first day of the school year, 2012, and ending on last day of the school year, 2052.
