Jacksonville Sheriff's Office Speeding and Aggressive Driving Project. The grant period commenced on July 1, 2022 and continues through September 30, 2023. No local match is required.

Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 2. Section 1 is to utilize grant funding from NHTSA, made available through FDOT as a Highway Traffic Safety Program subgrant, to establish the Jacksonville Sheriff's Office Speeding and Aggressive Driving Project (the "Project"). The purpose of the Project is to reduce the incidence of serious injuries and fatalities occurring in Duval County caused by speeding and aggressive driving and to improve the City of Jacksonville's statistical ranking measured under the Florida Strategic Highway Safety Plan. Funds will be used for a variety of Project expenses including overtime salaries and benefits for law enforcement officers, and to procure radar and laser equipment. A copy of the Subgrant for Highway Traffic Safety Funds, outlining the terms and conditions relative to the grant and use of the grant funds, has been placed **On File** with the Legislative Services Division.

Section 3. Oversight and Reporting. The Jacksonville Sheriff's Office, Patrol Support Division, shall oversee administration of the grant and Project described herein.

Section 4. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
