ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING HOME INVESTMENT PARTNERSHIP GRANT PROGRAM - AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN OF 2021 ("HOME-ARP") GRANT FUNDS IN THE AMOUNT OF \$12,060,074 FROM THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING AND URBAN DEVELOPMENT TO PROVIDE HOUSING, SERVICES AND SHELTER TO INDIVIDUALS EXPERIENCING HOMELESSNESS AND OTHER VULNERABLE POPULATIONS; APPROVING, AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, OR HIS DESIGNEE, AND THE CORPORATION SECRETARY TO EXECUTE A FORGIVABLE LOAN AGREEMENT WITH I.M. SULZBACHER CENTER FOR THE HOMELESS, ("SULZBACHER") FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF INC. AFFORDABLE HOUSING, AND ANY AND ALL DOCUMENTS NECESSARY TO EFFECTUATE THE INTENT OF THIS ORDINANCE; WAIVING SECTION 118.107 (NONPROFITS COMPETITIVE RECEIVE FUNDING THROUGH Α EVALUATED AWARD PROCESS), PART 1 PROVISIONS), CHAPTER 118 (CITY GRANTS), ORDINANCE CODE, TO ALLOW A DIRECT CONTRACT WITH SULZBACHER; PROVIDING FOR OVERSIGHT BY NEIGHBORHOODS DEPARTMENT, HOUSING AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DIVISION; REQUESTING ONE CYCLE

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BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Appropriation. For the 2022-2023 fiscal year, within the City's budget, there are hereby appropriated the indicated sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) listed in subsection (b):

(c) Explanation of Appropriation

The funding above represents an appropriation of Home Investment Partnership Grant Program - American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 ("HOME-ARP") grant funds for use in the provision of housing, services and shelter to individuals experiencing homelessness and other vulnerable Grant funds in the amount of \$12,000,000 populations. will be paid to I.M. Sulzbacher Center for the Homeless, Inc. ("Sulzbacher") in the form of a forgivable loan for the development of affordable housing. The City will retain \$60,074.00 for administrative costs to oversee the loan agreement and distribution of the grant funds.

Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to accept a one-time HOME-ARP grant from the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development ("HUD"), made available through the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, to provide additional homelessness assistance and services to individuals experiencing homelessness and other vulnerable populations. A copy

of the HUD grant award letter is attached hereto as **Exhibit 2.** A total of \$12,000,000 of the HOME-ARP grant funds will be disbursed to Sulzbacher in the form of a forgivable loan for construction of an affordable housing project in Jacksonville to be known as "Sulzbacher Enterprise Village." This development will be located on Walgreen Road near the intersection of Golfair Boulevard and Interstate-95 and will consist of a campus that offers approximately 100 units of multi-family residential housing for individuals experiencing homelessness with other wrap-around and supportive services (the "Project").

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Approval and Authorization to Execute. Section 3. Mayor, or his designee, and the Corporation Secretary are hereby authorized to execute and deliver a Forgivable Loan Agreement (the "Agreement") between the City of Jacksonville and I.M. Sulzbacher Center for the Homeless, Inc. providing for a forgivable loan to Sulzbacher for the Project in a not-to-exceed amount of \$12,000,000, subject to the terms and conditions of the HOME-ARP grant and the Term Sheet for HOME-ARP Rental Development Agreement attached hereto as Exhibit 3 and incorporated herein by this reference. The Agreement may include such additions, deletions and changes as may be reasonable, necessary and incidental for carrying out the purposes thereof, as may be acceptable to the Mayor, or his designee, with such inclusion and acceptance being evidenced by execution of the Agreement by the Mayor, or his designee; provided however, no modifications to the Agreement may increase the financial obligations of the City to an amount in excess of the amount stated in the Agreement or decrease the duties and obligations of Sulzbacher, and any such modifications shall be technical only and shall be subject to appropriate legal review and approval by the Office of General Counsel and the Office of Risk Management for appropriate insurance and indemnification terms. For the purposes of this Ordinance, the

term "technical changes" is defined as those changes having no financial impact to the City, changes required for compliance with the terms and conditions of the HOME-ARP grant and/or applicable federal or HUD rules, regulations or policies, and any other non-substantive changes that do not substantively increase the duties and responsibilities of the City under the provisions of the Agreement. The Mayor, or his designee, and the Corporation Secretary, are further hereby authorized to execute and deliver, for and on behalf of the City, any and all documents necessary to effectuate the intent of this Ordinance, including closing and other related documents relative to the forgivable loan.

funding through a competitive evaluated award process), Part 1 (General Provisions), Chapter 118 (City Grants), Ordinance Code. The provisions of Section 118.107 (Nonprofits to receive funding through a competitive evaluated award process), Part 1 (General Provisions), Chapter 118 (City Grants), Ordinance Code, are hereby waived to allow for a direct contract between I.M. Sulzbacher Center for the Homeless, Inc. and the City of Jacksonville. The City finds that the direct contract approved herein is justified because there is an extreme need for affordable housing in Duval County. Sulzbacher is a well-established non-profit that offers housing opportunities and a myriad of supportive services to homeless individuals and other vulnerable populations and is prepared to immediately begin construction of the Project, thus justifying this direct appropriation.

Section 5. Oversight Department. The Neighborhoods

Department, Housing and Community Development Division, shall oversee the project and agreement described herein.

Section 6. Requesting One Cycle Emergency Passage Pursuant to Council Rule 4.901 Emergency. One cycle emergency passage of this Ordinance is requested. The nature of the emergency is that

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Sulzbacher intends to apply for an additional \$5,000,000 in funding from Florida Housing Finance Corporation ("FHFC") and must do so by January 31, 2023. The City must make a funding commitment of \$12,000,000 before Sulzbacher applies to the Florida Housing Finance Corporation. Applying for this additional financing from FHFC will allow Sulzbacher to apply for 9% tax credits as opposed to 4% tax credits.

Section 7. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
