A RESOLUTION HONORING AND COMMENDING DONALD C. BOWDEN CREATIVE FOR HIS AND GENEROUS MANDARIN CONTRIBUTIONS ΤО THE MUSEUM HISTORICAL SOCIETY ("MMHS"), THEMANDARIN COMMUNITY, AND THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Donald C. Bowden is a life-long resident of Mandarin whose family roots in Mandarin date to the late 1700s; and

WHEREAS, after retiring from a successful career in the pump and well business, he found a unique way to give back to the Mandarin community, making and painting concrete frogs and placing them along the rural roads in Mandarin to simply make people smile; and

WHEREAS, in 2015, he began making frogs to sell to benefit the Mandarin Museum & Historical Society ("MMHS") and its renovation and restoration of the historic St. Joseph's Mission Schoolhouse for African-American Children following its relocation to the City's Walter Jones Historical Park; and

WHEREAS, the frogs immediately became popular and much soughtafter to the point that he has created and sold over 10,000 frogs, together with additional sea turtles and squirrels, with all of the proceeds going to MMHS; and

WHEREAS, Donald Bowden has refused any reimbursement or compensation for his time and materials and has raised over \$150,000 in support of MMHS and its mission and programs, including an expansion of the Mandarin Museum building owned by the City; and

WHEREAS, his philanthropic achievement was recognized in his

receiving the Cultural Council of Greater Jacksonville's prestigious "Art of Giving Award" in 2019; and

WHEREAS, Donald Bowden's "Mandarin Frogs" have brought the Mandarin community together in its enthusiasm for his unique folk art and through monthly frog painting parties at MMHS, where citizens can create their very own Mandarin Frogs; and

WHEREAS, Donald Bowden is now known as Mandarin's "Frog Man," serving as a goodwill ambassador for the Mandarin community, not only in Jacksonville, but well beyond, as his frogs have found their way to many other states and several foreign countries; and

WHEREAS, in 2022, Donald Bowden was chosen to receive the Nextdoor 100 Award, honoring the top 100 "Super Amazing Neighbors" in the United States; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. The City Council hereby honors and commends Donald C. Bowden, Mandarin's "Frog Man," on his generosity in using his unique talents to bring so much joy to people, while providing significant financial support to the Mandarin Museum & Historical Society. His selfless generosity and giving spirit serve as an example to his fellow Jacksonville citizens.
