6 AN ORDINANCE MAKING CERTAIN FINDINGS AND 7 AUTHORIZING THE BORROWING AND APPROPRIATION FROM THE CITY'S COMMERCIAL PAPER FACILITY AND/OR THE 8 9 ISSUANCE OF FIXED-RATE DEBT IN THE UP TO, 10 MAXIMUM AMOUNT OF \$20,000,000, TO PROVIDE A 11 GRANT ("GRANT") TO THE UNIVERSITY OF FLORIDA 12 BOARD OF TRUSTEES TO SUPPORT THE CREATION OF A 13 FINTECH GRADUATE EDUCATION CENTER WITHIN DUVAL 14 COUNTY, AS INITIATED BY B.T. 23-056; AMENDING 15 2022-504-E, THE FY 2022-2023 BUDGET ORDINANCE, 16 TO REPLACE THE FOURTH REVISED SCHEDULE B4 IN 17 ORDER TO AUTHORIZE THE BORROWING AND/OR THE ISSUANCE OF DEBT FOR THE "UNIVERSITY OF FLORIDA 18 19 HEALTH AND FINANCIAL TECHNOLOGY GRADUATE EDUCATION CENTER" PROJECT; AUTHORIZING THE CITY 20 21 TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH THE UNIVERSITY 22 OF FLORIDA BOARD OF TRUSTEES IN ACCORDANCE WITH 23 THE TERM SHEET ATTACHED HERETO TO PROVIDE THE 24 GRANT AS FURTHER DETAILED THEREIN; REQUESTING 25 THAT THE FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION DEPARTMENT 26 ADMINISTER THE AGREEMENT AUTHORIZED HEREIN; 27 PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

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WHEREAS, the University of Florida (the "University") intends to establish a Health and Financial Technology Graduate Education Center in the City of Jacksonville (the "Project"), and the City has agreed to fund up to 50% of the capital costs attendant thereto, in 1 the up to, maximum amount of \$50,000,000 over a three year period; 2 and

WHEREAS, pursuant to an agreement to be entered into consistent with the term sheet attached hereto as **Exhibit 1**, the City will provide \$20,000,000 to the University in the current fiscal year, and anticipates an additional appropriation of \$15,000,000 in each of the following two fiscal years for the Project; and

8 WHEREAS, the Project is estimated to have an aggregate cost of 9 \$100,000,000 over a three-year period; and

WHEREAS, the agreement will provide that the City funding will be disbursed lump sum on an annual basis, subject to City approval of a sources and use of funds document provided by the University regarding use of the Grant funds, with an audited financial statement provided at the end of each fiscal year detailing the actual use of such Grant funds, with all funding of the City utilized on a pro rata basis with other University-identified funding for the Project; and

WHEREAS, the Project will provide significant economic benefits to the City and its residents by providing increased economic activity, a new, higher education facility within the City, and high salary jobs in the City of Jacksonville and thus constitutes a valid governmental undertaking of the City; and

WHEREAS, the Project is in the public interest and the financial assistance contemplated herein take into account and give consideration to the long-term public interests and public interest benefits to be achieved by the City; and

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**BE IT ORDAINED** by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

27 Section 1. Findings. It is hereby ascertained, determined,
28 found and declared as follows:

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(a) The recitals set forth herein are true and correct.

30 (b) The Project will promote and further the public and 31 municipal purposes of the City.

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1 (c) Enhancement of the City's tax base and revenues, are 2 matters of State and City policy and State and City concern in order 3 that the State and its counties and municipalities, including the 4 City, shall not continue to be endangered by unemployment, 5 underemployment, economic recession, poverty, crime and disease, and consume an excessive proportion of the State and City revenues because 6 7 of the extra services required for police, fire, accident, health 8 care, elderly care, charity care, hospitalization, public housing and 9 housing assistance, and other forms of public protection, services 10 and facilities.

(d) The provision of the City's assistance as identified in the term sheet is necessary and appropriate to make the Project feasible; and the City's assistance is reasonable and not excessive, taking into account the extent of the public benefits expected to be derived from the Project, and taking into account all other forms of assistance available.

(e) The University of Florida and its contractors are qualified
to carry out and complete the construction and equipping of the
Project.

(f) The authorizations provided by this Ordinance are for public uses and purposes for which the City may use its powers as a county, municipality and as a political subdivision of the State of Florida and may expend public funds, and the necessity in the public interest for the provisions herein enacted is hereby declared as a matter of legislative determination.

(g) This Ordinance is adopted pursuant to the provisions of
Chapters 163, 166 and 125, Florida Statutes, as amended, the City's
Charter, and other applicable provisions of law.

Section 2. Appropriation. For the 2022-2023 fiscal year, within the City's budget, there are hereby appropriated the indicated sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) listed in subsection (b): (B.T. 23-056, attached hereto as Exhibit 2

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 and incorporated herein by this reference):

(C) **Explanation of Appropriation** 

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The funding above appropriates up to \$20,000,000 from the City's Commercial Paper Facility and/or the issuance of fixed rate debt to provide a grant to the University of Florida for the creation of a Health and Financial Technology Graduate Education Center within the City.

12 Section 3. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in 13 Section 2 is to appropriate funding for a City grant in the amount 14 of \$20,000,000, to be used on a pro rata basis with other funding 15 identified by the University, for the capital needs of the University 16 in creating a Health and Financial Technology Graduate Education 17 Center within the City.

18 Section 4. Carryover. The funds appropriated in this 19 Ordinance shall not lapse but shall carryover to fiscal year 2023-20 2024.

Section 5. Amending 2022-504-E, the FY 2022-2023 Budget 21 Ordinance, to replace the Fourth Revised Schedule B4 to allow funding 22 for the University of Florida Fintech Graduate Education Center 23 24 project. 2022-504-E, the FY 2022-2023 Budget Ordinance, is hereby 25 amended to replace the Fourth Revised Schedule B4, entitled "FY 22-26 23 Debt Management Fund Detail," in order to allow for the funding 27 by the City of the University of Florida Health and Financial Technology Graduate Education Center project as authorized herein. 28 29 The Fifth Revised Schedule B4 is attached hereto as Exhibit 3.

30 Section 6. Authorizing the Borrowing and Appropriation of 31 Funds from the City's Commercial Paper Program. The City is hereby

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authorized to borrow under its Commercial Paper Program and/or issue fixed-rate debt in the maximum amount of up to \$20,000,000 and such funds are hereby appropriated to fund a portion of the Project, consistent with the Agreement, defined below. The authorization set forth in this Section is subject to the requirements and prerequisites of the Commercial Paper Program and/or bond programs.

7 Section 7. Authorizing the City to enter into an agreement 8 with the University of Florida. The City is hereby authorized to 9 negotiate and enter into an Agreement with the University of Florida 10 ("Agreement") substantially in accordance with the term sheet 11 attached hereto as Exhibit 1, for the purposes of providing the City 12 Grant funds to partially fund the Project in conjunction with other 13 financial sources.

14 Section 8. Oversight Department. The Finance and 15 Administration Department shall provide oversight for the Agreement 16 authorized herein.

Section 9. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
