RESOLUTION 2023-66-A

A RESOLUTION HONORING AND COMMEMORATING THE LIFE AND ACCOMPLISHMENTS OF HARRY FRISCH AND EXTENDING CONDOLENCES TO HIS FAMILY, FRIENDS, AND MANY ADMIRERS; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Hans "Harry" Frisch was born in Vienna, Austria in 1923, fled the incoming Nazi regime with his family in 1928 through Czechoslovakia to Palestine and, after running a successful auto repair shop in the new nation of Israel, immigrated to the United States in 1953 to reunite with his family who had moved to America several years earlier; and

WHEREAS, when he arrived in the Unites States, Mr. Frisch came to Jacksonville where his mother, stepfather and brother started a fish market on Beaver Street that over the years has grown into the Beaver Street Fisheries empire we know today; and

WHEREAS, through hard work, honest dealing and the application of good common sense, Harry Frisch and his parents, brother, sons and now grandchildren have grown the family's small business into an international seafood supplier, employing more than 400 people in the United States and in the Bahamas and shipping seafood and other foods and supplies across the country and around the world to more than 50 countries. He exercised the wisdom of "using your head" and made personal relationships with and commitment to both his customers and his employees the foundation of his business

success; and

WHEREAS, concurrent with his great success as a businessman, Mr. Frisch was extremely active in civic affairs and philanthropic endeavors, returning a great share of his success to his adopted community through such ventures as the Jacksonville Farmer's Market, through the Beaver Street Foundation which supports numerous not-for-profits serving the needs of the Jacksonville community, and his service on the boards of Etz Chaim Synagogue and the River Garden Foundation; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Frisch was the recipient of countless awards and honors over the years in recognition of his investment in and devotion to time and talent to the community. Just a small sampling includes the First Coast 50 Award by KPMG, the Thomas S. Baker SOLID AS A ROCK Award by Junior Achievement, induction into the First Coast Business Hall of Fame by the Florida Council on Economic Education, receipt of the Humanitarian Award Silver Medallion from OneJax, and the Service to Agriculture Award by the Duval County Farm Bureau; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Frisch was a legendary figure in Jacksonville's business and civic circles and his recent passing at the age of 99 will leave a vacant spot in the fabric of our community; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. The City of Jacksonville hereby honors and commemorates the life and accomplishments of Hans "Harry" Frisch on the occasion of his passing and extends to his family, friends, and many admirers the City Council's sincere condolences on his passing. His example of hard work, honest dealing and civic spirit stand as a model for responsible leadership and corporate engagement, and his life and legacy will be long and gratefully remembered.

Section 2. Effective Date. This Resolution shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
