WHEREAS, in accordance with Part 2 (Executive Reorganization), Chapter 21 (Executive Branch, Generally), Ordinance Code, the Mayor, after investigation, has determined that an executive reorganization of the Office of Grants and Contract Compliance, Finance and Administration Department, is appropriate considering the increased number of federal, state, and local grant funds that the City of Jacksonville is responsible for administering; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor deems it appropriate to (i) elevate the Office of Grants and Contract Compliance from an office to a division within the Finance and Administration Department; and (ii) create a division chief position to manage the Grants and Contract Compliance Division functions; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Section 21.202 (Powers and duties of Mayor), Ordinance Code, the Mayor has developed an executive reorganization plan for the Office of Grants and Contract Compliance, Finance and Administration Department; now therefore

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Recitals. The recitals above are true and

correct and incorporated herein by this reference.

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Section 2. Appropriation of Funds to Effectuate Reorganization, as Initiated by B.T. 23-037.

(c) Explanation of Appropriation - The funding above is being appropriated from the General Fund GSD fund balance account for the Chief of Grants and Contract Compliance Division position salary, benefits, and internal service allocations.

Section 3. Office of Grants and Contract Compliance, Finance and Administration Department Executive Reorganization; Statement of Plan. This Ordinance is being enacted for the purpose of reorganizing and restructuring the Office of Grants and Contract Compliance within the Executive Branch of the City government pursuant to Part 2 (Executive Reorganization), Chapter 21 (Executive Branch, Generally), Ordinance Code, in connection with the Mayor's executive reorganization plan which has been transmitted to the Council and is attached hereto as Exhibit 2.

Section 4. Repealing Part 9 (Office of Grants and Contract Compliance), Chapter 24 (Finance and Administration Department), Ordinance Code. Part 9 (Office of Grants and Contract Compliance), Chapter 24 (Finance and Administration Department), Ordinance Code, is hereby repealed and replaced in its entirety. Copies of the repealed Part 9, Chapter 24, Ordinance Code, is attached hereto as

Exhibit 3.

Section 5. Creating a new Part 9 (Grants and Contract Compliance Division), Chapter 24 (Finance and Administration Department), Ordinance Code. A new Part 9 (Grants and Contract Compliance Division), Chapter 24 (Finance and Administration Department), Ordinance Code, is hereby created to read as follows:

CHAPTER 24 - FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION DEPARTMENT

* * *

PART 9. - GRANTS AND CONTRACT COMPLIANCE DIVISION

Sec. 24.901. - Establishment.

There is created a Grants and Contract Compliance Division. The Division shall ensure the City of Jacksonville receives the broadest utilization of grant resources and manages such resources and relationships.

Sec. 24.902. - Division Chief.

The Chief of the Grants and Contract Compliance Division shall be the head of the Division. The Chief of the Grants and Contract Compliance Division shall be appointed by the Mayor, subject to confirmation by the Council, shall serve at the pleasure of the Mayor, and shall have a bachelor's degree or higher from an accredited college or university and at least three years' experience in grant management.

Sec. 24.903. - Division functions.

- The Division shall be responsible and accountable for appropriate grant and contract compliance in accordance with funding policy. The Division shall:
- (a) Endeavor to obtain external funds for internal City of Jacksonville Department projects and functions, established in the annual budget thereby reducing or eliminating the use of general fund dollars for those internal City of Jacksonville projects;
- (b) Direct resource development strategies including but not limited

to recommendations concerning identification of external grant resources, private sector partners, in-kind resources to include equipment, services, and staff for internal City of Jacksonville projects;

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- (c) Direct and/or provide oversight of research and evaluation in collaboration with appropriate agency representatives to determine needs and assess feasibility of new program ideas and proposals as they relate to possible external funding and resources for internal City of Jacksonville projects;
- (d) Direct, advise, and consult with all appropriate staff and partners regarding grant application specifications such as program descriptions, work plans, and timelines;
- 13 (e) Administer budget computations, statistical analysis, program/budget narratives for completion of applications;
 - (f) Administer and oversee grant writing initiatives, program monitoring, and assure communication with both internal and external program administrators throughout the life of any resource award;
 - (g) Ensure agency compliance with regulatory standards concerning resource development opportunities including compliance with federal, state, and local laws, rules, fiscal requirements, agency policies, programmatic guidelines, and appropriate contracts/agreements;
 - (h) Oversee training of city-wide staff engaged in grant writing, administration, and compliance which includes informal training, cross training, and formal training such as conducting grant writing workshops; and
 - (i) Staff the Public Service Grants Council and forward any recommendations from the Council to the Director of Finance and Administration.
 - Section 6. Amending Section 80.104 (Organization and proceedings), Chapter 80 (Public Service Grant Council), Ordinance

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Section 80.104 (Organization and proceedings), Chapter 80 (Public Service Grant Council), Ordinance Code, is hereby amended to read as follows:

CHAPTER 80 - PUBLIC SERVICE GRANT COUNCIL

Sec. 80.104. - Organization and proceedings.

Administrative support. The PSG Council shall receive staff support from the Office of Grants and Contract Compliance Division.

Section 7. Amending Sections 117.111 (Grant awards follow Uniform Federal or State Procurement Rules or Procurement Code) and 117.112 (Reporting), Chapter 117 (Grants), Ordinance Code. Sections 117.111 (Grant awards to follow Uniform Federal or State Procurement Rules or Procurement Code) and 117.112 (Reporting), Chapter 117 (Grants), Ordinance Code, are hereby amended to read as follows:

Chapter 117 - GRANTS

Sec. 117.111. - Grant awards to follow Uniform Federal or State Procurement Rules or Procurement Code.

Consistent with Section 126.113, Ordinance Code, and applicable, the City must comply with federal and/or state procurement requirements, including 2 CFR Part 200-Uniform Administrative Requirements, Costs Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards (2 CFR 200), but may enact more stringent requirements than state or federal law imposes. Where applicable, grant applications submitted on behalf of the City shall include vendors who have been reviewed by the Office of Grants and Contract Compliance Division and determined by the Office of Grants and Contract Compliance Division

to meet the vendor eligibility requirements established by the agency issuing the grant funding. Where feasible, the City shall utilize a competitive procurement process pursuant to Chapter 126 (Procurement Code) to allocate and disburse funding received from grants to

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nonprofits or other third parties. Sec. 117.112. - Reporting.

Beginning on October 1, 2022, and occurring on April 1 and October 1 of each year thereafter, the Office of Grants and Contract Compliance Division shall submit a comprehensive written report to the Council which includes grant awards received by all departments, boards and commissions subject to Chapter 117 for the six-month time period immediately preceding the reporting date. For grant awards by other departments, boards or commissions, managed departments, boards or commissions are required to submit their grant award information for the same time period to the Office of Grants and Contract Compliance Division by September 1 and March 1 of that same year so that the Office of Grants and Contract Compliance Division can compile the reporting information into one comprehensive report. Such written report shall contain at a minimum the following information regarding grants which have been awarded in the six-month time period immediately preceding:

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Sec. 118.104. - Definitions.

Section 8. Amending Section 118.104 (Definitions), Part 1 (General Provisions), Chapter 118 (City Grants), Ordinance Code. Section 118.104 (Definitions), Part 1 (General Provisions), Chapter 118 (City Grants), Ordinance Code, is hereby amended to read as follows:

CHAPTER 118 - CITY GRANTS

(i) Grants Administrator means the individual designated by the Chief of the Grants and Contract Compliance Division.

- $(\frac{1}{2})$ Grant Monitor means the <u>individual</u> designated individual by the City Department or by the Cultural Council that is responsible for the monitoring of the appropriation during the term of the agreement.
- $(\frac{1}{2}\underline{k})$ Public Service Grant means an appropriation made by the City Council to a requesting agency based upon the funding recommendations of the Public Service Grant Council as provided in Part 8 hereof.
- $(\frac{1}{2})$ Public Service Grant Council means the citizen council appointed in accordance with Part 8 hereof, and which is responsible for making funding recommendations with respect to Public Service Grants.
- $(\underline{+}\underline{m})$ Most Vulnerable Persons and Needs is a group of citizens with common needs and traits requiring public services from Requesting Agencies, whose needs have justified priority consideration over other deserving populations or groups in competition for City funding. $(\underline{m}\underline{n})$ Recipient means a public or private entity, organization, firm or individual to whom the City Council has appropriated City funds and to whom the Cultural Council has allocated appropriated City funds pursuant to the provisions of this Chapter.
- (<u>no</u>) Requesting Agency means a public or private entity, organization, firm or individual who is requesting an appropriation of City funds from the City Council pursuant to the provisions of this Chapter or who is requesting an allocation from the Cultural Council of appropriated City funds pursuant to the provisions of this Chapter.

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Section 9. Amending Sections 118.803 (Grants Administrator; Responsibilities) and 118.807 (Review, evaluation and

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scoring of applications by PSG Council), Part 8 (Public Service Grants), Chapter 118 (City Grants), Ordinance Code. Sections 118.803 (Grants Administrator; Responsibilities) and 118.807 (Review, evaluation and scoring of applications by PSG Council), Part 8 (Public Service Grants), Chapter 118 (City Grants), Ordinance Code, are hereby amended to read as follows:

CHAPTER 118 - CITY GRANTS

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PART 8. - PUBLIC SERVICE GRANTS

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Sec. 118.803. - Grants Administrator; Responsibilities.

Support; Mandatory Staff Application Workshop. The Grants Administrator and Grants Office and Contract Compliance Division shall provide staff support to the PSG Council and assist with the Annual Training Course required in Section 80.104(i). In addition, the Grants Administrator, or his or her designee, shall conduct a mandatory application workshop ("Mandatory Application Workshop") for requesting agencies within 30 days following the effective date of the Most Vulnerable Persons and Needs legislation adopted by the City Council. In order for For requesting agencies to be eligible to apply for a Service Grant, a requesting agency must attend and complete the Mandatory Application Workshop. The Mandatory Application Workshop shall be noticed to the public in the same manner in which way PSG Council meetings are noticed. The Mandatory Application Workshop shall be conducted twice in May and a requesting agency may attend either workshop to meet the requirement under this Section.

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Sec. 118.807. - Review, evaluation and scoring of applications by PSG Council.

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(d) Tentative Adoption of Rankings by PSG Council. The PSG Council shall announce the rankings for each application belonging to a Priority Population or Priority Need at a meeting in the first full week of October of each year and adopt a tentative ranking and funding allocation list. Copies of each requesting agency's completed score sheets, together with any other support information or justification from the application scorer regarding the application score, shall be made available to requesting agencies at such meeting. A requesting agency will also be notified in writing by the Grants Office and Contract Compliance Division of its application score and ranking. A requesting agency may appeal a score sheet or ranking decision made pursuant to this Part through

the appeals procedure set forth in Section 118.810.

* * *

Section 10. Approval of Position. There is hereby approved the position more fully described in R.C. 23-066, attached hereto as Exhibit 4 and incorporated herein by this reference.

Section 11. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 2 above is provide for the funding to support the new Grants and Contract Compliance Division chief position resulting from the reorganization set forth in this ordinance.

Section 12. Codification Instructions. The Codifier and the Office of General Counsel are authorized to make all chapter and division "tables of contents" consistent with the changes set forth herein. Such editorial changes and any others necessary to make the Ordinance Code consistent with the intent of this legislation are approved and directed herein, and changes to the Ordinance Code shall be made forthwith and when inconsistencies are discovered.

Section 13. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
