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3 ORDINANCE 2023-161 4 5 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 150 (ADULT ENTERTAINMENT AND SERVICES CODE), PART 1 6 7 (GENERAL PROVISIONS), SECTION 150.104 8 (RESERVED) AND PART 2 (ADMINISTRATION), SECTION 9 150.224 (PERFORMER WORK IDENTIFICATION CARD), ORDINANCE CODE, TO REMOVE LANGAUAGE REGARDING 10 THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THE PROHIBITION OF 11 PERFORMERS UNDER AGE TWENTY-ONE; AMENDING 12 CHAPTER 151 (DANCING 13 ENTERTAINMENT ESTABLISHMENT CODE), PART 1 (GENERAL PROVISIONS) 14 TO CREATE A NEW SECTION 151.104 (PERFORMER AGE 15 RESTRICTION) AND AMENDING PART 2 16 (ADMINISTRATION), SECTION 151.214 (PERFORMER 17 WORK IDENTIFICATION CARD), ORDINANCE CODE, TO 18 REMOVE LANGAUAGE REGARDING THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF 19 20 THE PROHIBITION OF PERFORMERS UNDER AGE TWENTY-21 ONE AND THE DISQUALIFYING CRIME OF "HUMAN 22 TRAFFICKING RELATED CHARGE"; PROVIDING CODIFICATION INSTRUCTIONS; REQUESTING EMERGENCY 23 PASSAGE UPON INTRODUCTION; PROVIDING AN 24 25 EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, on February 27, 2023, in the case of Wackos Too, Inc., et al. v. City of Jacksonville, case no. 3:20-cv-00303-TJC-MCR ("Wackos Lawsuit"), the federal judge ruled the City's ban on performers under the age of twenty-one at adult and dancing entertainment establishments is constitutional; and

WHEREAS, the language adopted by the Council in 2022-172-E to 1 2 effectuate the ban contained language that indicated the provision would not take effect until either the ban was determined to be 3 legally constitutional in the litigation, or the City was otherwise 4 5 not prohibited from enforcing the ban - such language now being superfluous and problematic for enforcement of the regulation; 6

7 WHEREAS, the intent of this legislation is to institute the ban 8 on underage performers and remove the disqualification for performers 9 convicted of a "human trafficking related charge" and is not meant 10 to address any other provision in Chapters 150 and 151, Ordinance Code addressed by the Court in the Wackos Lawsuit; now therefore, 11

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BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Amending Chapter 150 (Adult Entertainment and 13 Section 1. Services Code), Part 1 (General Provisions), Section 150.104 14 (Reserved) and Part 2 (Administration), Section 150.224 (Performer 15 work identification card), Ordinance Code. Chapter 150 (Adult 16 17 Entertainment and Services Code), Part 1 (General Provisions), Section 150.104 (Reserved) and Part 2 (Administration), Section 18 19 150.224 (Performer work identification card), Ordinance Code, is 20 hereby amended to read as follows:

CHAPTER 150. ADULT ENTERTAINMENT AND SERVICES CODE.

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PART 1. GENERAL PROVISIONS

24 25 Sec. 150.104. ReservedPerformer Age Restriction. 26 No performer under twenty-one (21) years of age shall be 27 allowed to perform at any establishment regulated under this Chapter. 28 29 PART 2. ADMINISTRATION 30 31 Sec. 150.224. Performer work identification card.

2 Application for Work Identification Card. An application (C) for a Work Identification Card shall be obtained from the Sheriff. 3 The application shall include: the applicant's full legal name 4 5 (including maiden name, if applicable); residential address; driver's license number or government issued identification or passport 6 7 number; date of birth; natural hair and eye color; race; sex; height 8 and weight; place of birth (city, state or country); telephone number; 9 email address; a list of locations of and descriptions of any tattoos; 10 confirmation that the applicant has not been convicted within the relevant periods of time of any violation listed in subparagraph (1), 11 12 and a list of each adult entertainment establishment where the applicant will be performing and each stage name used by the applicant 13 at each location. Each applicant shall affirm through either 14 15 attestation on the application or presentation of a certificate of completion to the Sheriff that he or she has completed one, free-of-16 17 charge, sex trafficking education program presented by the Polaris (https://polarisproject.org/training/) (approximately 45 18 Project 19 min. in length) or the U.S. Department of Homeland Security, Blue 20 Campaign Consequences Training (https://www.dhs.gov/blue-21 campaign/course consequences p01) (approximately 15 min. in length). 22 The Sheriff shall maintain and make available to any applicant each 23 sex trafficking education program in the event any applicant does not 24 have online access to the program(s). Additionally, the applicant 25 shall affirm that he or she understands that the Work Identification 26 Card may be immediately revoked if issuance of the card is made 27 illegal through order of any court. The application shall be in 28 writing, signed and notarized, fully completed and submitted to the 29 Sheriff together with the nonrefundable application fee. Each applicant must submit proof of identity at the time the application 30 31 is submitted. It is the Council's inten that noNo Work Identification

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Card shall be issued to any applicant who is under the age of twenty-1 2 one (21) years of age; however, this requirement shall not become 3 effective unless and until the legality of this age restriction is determined to be valid or the City is otherwise not legally prevented 4 5 from imposing this restriction. No Work Identification Card shall be issued to an applicant who has been convicted of human trafficking 6 7 or any human trafficking-related charge or who is currently on suspension for any violation listed under subsection (1), below. Work 8 9 Identification Cards are valid for a term of one (1) year. Applicants 10 are required to update his or her application with changes to any of the application information (except height and weight) within 60 days 11 of the change of such information. All current performers shall 12 complete and submit an application for a Work Identification Card 13 within ninety (90) days from the effective date of this section (the 14 15 "Grace Period"). Upon conclusion of the Grace Period, no performer shall be permitted to perform until a current Work Identification 16 17 Card is obtained or without a valid copy of the application fee 18 payment check or receipt as specified in subparagraph (e), below.

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20 Section 2. Amending Chapter 151 (Dancing Entertainment 21 Establishment Code), Part 1 (General Provisions) to create a new Section 151.104 (Performer age restriction) and amending Part 2 22 23 (Administration), Section 151.214 (Performer work identification 24 card), Ordinance Code. Chapter 151 (Dancing Entertainment 25 Establishment Code), Part 1 (General Provisions) and Part 2 26 (Administration), Section 151.214 (Performer work identification 27 card), Ordinance Code, is hereby amended to read as follows:

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PART 1. GENERAL PROVISIONS

CHAPTER 151. DANCING ENTERTAINMENT ESTABLISHMENT CODE.

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Sec. 151.104. Performer Age Restriction. No performer under twenty-one (21) years of age shall be allowed to perform at any establishment regulated under this Chapter. \* \* \*

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PART 2. ADMINISTRATION

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Sec. 151.214. Performer work identification card.

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9 (C) Application for Work Identification Card. An application 10 for a Work Identification Card shall be obtained from the Sheriff. The application shall include: the applicant's full legal name 11 12 (including maiden name, if applicable); residential address; driver's license number, government issued identification or passport number; 13 date of birth; natural hair and eye color; race; sex; height and 14 15 weight; place of birth (city, state or country); telephone number; email address; a list of locations of and descriptions of any tattoos; 16 17 confirmation that the applicant has not been convicted within the relevant periods of time of any violation listed in subparagraph (1), 18 19 and a list of each dancing entertainment establishment where the 20 applicant will be performing and each stage name used by the applicant 21 at each location. Each applicant shall affirm through either 22 attestation on the application or presentation of a certificate of 23 completion to the Sheriff that he or she has completed one, free-of-24 charge, sex trafficking education program the Polaris Project 25 (https://polarisproject.org/training/) (approximately 45 min. in 26 length), or the U.S. Department of Homeland Security , Blue Campaign (https://www.dhs.gov/blue-27 Training Consequences 28 campaign/course consequences p01) (approximately 15 min. in length). 29 The Sheriff shall maintain and make available to any Applicant each sex trafficking education program free-of-charge in the event any 30 applicant does not have online access to the program(s). Additionally, 31

the applicant shall affirm that he or she understands that the Work 1 Identification Card may be immediately revoked if issuance of the 2 3 card is made illegal through order of any court. The application shall be in writing, signed, fully completed and submitted to the 4 5 Sheriff together with the nonrefundable application fee. Each applicant must submit proof of identity at the time the application 6 7 is submitted. It is the Council's intent that noNo Work Identification Card shall be issued to any applicant who is under the age of twenty-8 9 one (21) years of age; however, this requirement shall not become effective unless and until the legality of this age restriction is 10 11 determined to be valid or the City is otherwise not legally prevented 12 from imposing this restriction. No Work Identification Card shall be issued to an applicant who has been convicted of human trafficking 13 or any human trafficking-related charge or who is currently on 14 15 suspension for any violation listed under subsection (1), below. Work Identification Cards are valid for a term of one (1) year. 16 All 17 current performers shall complete and submit an application for a Work Identification Card within ninety (90) days from the effective 18 date of this section (the "Grace Period"). Upon conclusion of the 19 20 Grace Period, no performer shall be permitted to perform until a 21 current Work Identification Card is obtained or without a valid copy 22 of the application fee payment check or receipt as specified in 23 subparagraph (e), below.

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25 Section 3. Codification Instructions. The Codifier and the 26 Office of General Counsel are authorized to make all chapter and 27 division "table of contents" consistent with the changes set forth 28 herein. Such editorial changes and any other necessary changes to 29 make the Ordinance Code consistent with the intent of this legislation 30 are approved and directed herein, and the changes to the Ordinance 31 Code shall be made forthwith and when inconsistencies are discovered.

Section 4. Requesting Emergency Passage Upon Introduction 1 2 Pursuant to Council Rule 4.901 Emergency. Emergency passage upon 3 introduction of this legislation is requested. The nature of the emergency is that the Council identified that individuals under age 4 twenty-one are particularly susceptible to human and sex trafficking 5 at adult entertainment clubs. Implementation of this regulation has 6 7 been delayed due to the legal challenge filed by nearly every adult entertainment club in Jacksonville, who unsuccessfully challenged the 8 9 constitutionality of this restriction, even though the same 10 restriction in the state of Louisiana was upheld. There is an ongoing vulnerability for young performers every day in these clubs and 11 implementation of this regulation needs to begin immediately for the 12 health, safety and welfare of these at-risk individuals, and emergency 13 passage upon introduction of this legislation is necessary. 14

15 Section 5. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become 16 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective 17 without the Mayor's signature.
