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ORDINANCE 2023-53-E

AN ORDINANCE REGARDING ETHICS EDUCATION AND TRAINING; AMENDING SECTION 602.1001 (ETHICS EDUCATION), CHAPTER 602 (JACKSONVILLE ETHICS CODE), ORDINANCE CODE, TO ALLOW THE ETHICS DIRECTOR TO SET THE TIME FOR TRAINING AND TO ALLOW FOR DIGITAL CONFIRMATION OF COMPLETION OF TRAINING; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Jacksonville Ethics Commission held a public meeting on January 11, 2023, to consider and approve amendments to Chapter 602, Part 10, of the Jacksonville Ordinance Code; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 3.106, Ord. Code, the January 11, 2023 minutes of the Jacksonville Ethics Commission are attached as Exhibit 1; now therefore

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Amending Section 602.1001 (Ethics education program), Part 10 (Ethics Education), Chapter 602 (Jacksonville Ethics Code), Ordinance Code. Section 602.1001 (Ethics education program), Ordinance Code, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Chapter 602. Jacksonville Ethics Code.

Part 10. Ethics Education.

Sec. 602.1001. Ethics education program.

Officers and employees of the City, as public servants, ar

considered stewards of the public's trust and should aspire to the highest level of integrity and character. Officers and employees shall be informed of their ethical responsibilities at the start of their work with the City and shall receive updates and training materials on ethics issues throughout the span of their public service, as designated by the City Ethics Office and Ethics Officer(s).

- (a) Every officer and employee of the City must be responsible for understanding and complying with the provisions of this Chapter.
- (b) Every elected official shall attend an Ethics in Government Program within a time period set by the Ethics Director, with notification to the Office of General Counsel, with the concurrence of the General Counsel, but said time period shall not be less than 45 days following certification of election. Upon fulfillment of this requirement, each elected official will be issued a digital certificate confirmation of completion by the Jacksonville Ethics Office. Constitutional Officers complying with the State requirements and who submit proof of same and affirm that they have also read and understood the requirements of Chapter 602, Jacksonville Ethics Code, Ordinance Code, shall be issued a digital certificate confirmation of completion by the Jacksonville Ethics Office.
