A RESOLUTION COMMEMORATING THE LEGACY OF JACOBS JEWELERS, FLORIDA'S OLDEST JEWELRY STORE, AND HONORING THE RETIREMENT OF ITS OWNERS, ROY AND DELORISE THOMAS, WHO PROVIDED MORE THAN SIX DECADES OF OUTSTANDING SERVICE IN DOWNTOWN JACKSONVILLE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

14 WHEREAS, the business now known as Jacobs Jewelers was founded 15 in 1867 on Bay Street by Damon Greenleaf who was later joined by J.H. Crosby in 1890 and together they operated a jewelry business as 16 17 Greenleaf & Crosby. The business being very successful, the partners 18 constructed the impressive building bearing their names at the corner of Laura and Adams Streets to house the store in 1927, and in 1930 19 20 sold the business and building to V.E. Jacobs for whom Jacobs Jewelers 21 was named; and

WHEREAS, Roy and Delorise Thomas married in 1960 and went into the jewelry business together that year, leasing a small retail space in the May-Cohens department store in the St. James Building (now City Hall) for their first shop. In 1968 the Thomases moved two blocks south on Laura Street to work at Jacobs Jewelers in the Greenleaf & Crosby Building; and

WHEREAS, Roy and Delorise Thomas purchased Jacobs Jewelers in 1986 and for nearly four decades have maintained its status as a downtown icon, providing the highest quality merchandise and friendly, personal service to generations of patrons. The store carries a full range of jewelry, gems, watches and clocks, fine china,
and gift items, and has been a destination for generations of shoppers
seeking specialty gifts for many important life occasions; and

WHEREAS, the Thomases have also been the protective custodians of the iconic Seth Thomas four-sided clock originally purchased by Greenleaf and Crosby for their Bay Street store following Jacksonville's Great Fire of 1901, and relocated to their new store in 1927. Mr. Thomas oversaw the complete restoration and refurbishment of the clock in 1995 and gifted it to the City of Jacksonville; and

10 WHEREAS, Roy and Delorise Thomas have recently announced their 11 retirement from the jewelry business after 62 years in downtown 12 Jacksonville, and Jacobs Jewelers, the oldest jewelry store in Florida 13 and a cornerstone of downtown, will be closing its doors after serving 14 generations of customers for 155 years; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

16 Section 1. The City Council hereby commemorates the legacy 17 of Jacobs Jewelers and honors and commends Roy and Delorise Thomas 18 for their six decades of outstanding professional and personal service 19 to the citizens of Jacksonville. The City Council wishes Mr. and Mrs. 20 Thomas many happy and healthy years in their retirement and thanks 21 them for all they have done for downtown Jacksonville.
