(CJDT) Implementation Assistance Program, to the Jacksonville Sheriff's Office to implement the Criminal Justice Data Transparency/Uniform Arrest Affidavit project (the "CJDT/UAA Project"). The grant period commenced on July 1, 2022 and continues through June 30, 2023. No local match is required.

Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 2. Section 1 is to utilize grant funding from the Florida Department of Law Enforcement to implement the CJDT/UAA Project. A portion of the funds (\$65,000.00) will be used to purchase computer equipment necessary to meet the technological requirements of the CJDT/UAA Project, including storage, memory and CPU needs. The remaining funds (\$83,000.00) will be used to procure professional services required to meet Criminal Justice Data Transparency reporting requirements, including development of an interface between the Jail Management System and inmate look-up website, deploying a public facing website, and completing custom file source coding needed to meet Florida CJDT/UAA standards. A copy of the Grant Award outlining the terms and conditions relative to the grant and use of the grant funds is attached hereto as Exhibit 2 and incorporated herein by this reference.

Section 3. Oversight. The Jacksonville Sheriff's Office shall oversee administration of the grant and project described herein.

Section 4. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
