ORDINANCE MAKING CERTAIN FINDINGS AN AND AUTHORIZING THE BORROWING AND APPROPRIATION FROM THE CITY'S COMMERCIAL PAPER FACILITY AND/OR THE ISSUANCE OF FIXED-RATE DEBT IN THE UP TO, MAXIMUM AMOUNT OF \$20,000,000, TO PROVIDE A GRANT ("GRANT") TO THE UNIVERSITY OF FLORIDA BOARD OF TRUSTEES TO SUPPORT THE CREATION OF A FINTECH GRADUATE EDUCATION CENTER WITHIN DUVAL COUNTY, AS INITIATED BY REVISED B.T. 23-056; AMENDING 2022-504-E, THE FY 2022-2023 BUDGET ORDINANCE, TO REPLACE THE FOURTH REVISED SCHEDULE B4 IN ORDER TO AUTHORIZE THE BORROWING AND/OR THE ISSUANCE OF DEBT FOR THE "UNIVERSITY OF FLORIDA HEALTH AND FINANCIAL TECHNOLOGY GRADUATE EDUCATION CENTER" PROJECT; AUTHORIZING THE CITY TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH THE UNIVERSITY OF FLORIDA BOARD OF TRUSTEES IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE SECOND REVISED TERM SHEET ATTACHED HERETO TO PROVIDE THE GRANT AS FURTHER WAIVING SECTION DETAILED THEREIN; 118.107 (NONPROFITS TO RECEIVE FUNDING THROUGH COMPETITIVE EVALUATED AWARD PROCESS), PART 1 (GENERAL PROVISIONS), CHAPTER 118 (CITY GRANTS), ORDINANCE CODE, TO DIRECT CONTRACT WITH THE UNIVERSITY OF FLORIDA BOARD OF TRUSTEES;

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REQUESTING THAT THE FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION DEPARTMENT ADMINISTER THE AGREEMENT AUTHORIZED HEREIN; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the University of Florida (the "University") intends to establish a Health and Financial Technology Graduate Education Center in the City of Jacksonville (the "Project"), and the City has agreed to fund a portion of the capital costs attendant thereto, in the up to, maximum amount of \$50,000,000 over a three year period; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to an agreement to be entered into consistent with the term sheet attached hereto as Second Revised Exhibit 1, labeled as "Second Revised Exhibit 1, 2nd Rev Term Sheet, March 7, 2023 - Finance", the City will provide \$20,000,000 to the University in the current fiscal year, and anticipates an additional appropriation of \$15,000,000 in each of the following two fiscal years for the Project; and

WHEREAS, the Project is estimated to have a minimum aggregate cost of \$150,000,000 over a three-year period; and

WHEREAS, the agreement will provide that the City funds will be disbursed quarterly, on a reimbursement basis, subject to City review and approval of a reimbursement request provided by the University detailing the use of funds and demonstrating use of other University-identified (non-City) funding for the Project equal to or exceeding the amount requested for reimbursement by the City as outlined in Second Revised Exhibit 1; and

WHEREAS, the Project will provide significant economic benefits to the City and its residents by providing increased economic activity, a new, higher education facility within the City, and high salary jobs in the City of Jacksonville and thus constitutes a valid governmental undertaking of the City; and

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WHEREAS, the Project is in the public interest and the financial assistance contemplated herein take into account and give consideration to the long-term public interests and public interest benefits to be achieved by the City; now therefore

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Findings. It is hereby ascertained, determined, found and declared as follows:

- The recitals set forth herein are true and correct. (a)
- The Project will promote and further the public and (b) municipal purposes of the City.
- (c) Enhancement of the City's tax base and revenues, matters of State and City policy and State and City concern in order that the State and its counties and municipalities, including the City, shall not continue to be endangered by unemployment, underemployment, economic recession, poverty, crime and disease, and consume an excessive proportion of the State and City revenues because of the extra services required for police, fire, accident, health care, elderly care, charity care, hospitalization, public housing and housing assistance, and other forms of public protection, services and facilities.
- The provision of the City's assistance as identified in the term sheet is necessary and appropriate to make the Project feasible; and the City's assistance is reasonable and not excessive, taking into account the extent of the public benefits expected to be derived from the Project, and taking into account all other forms of assistance available.
- The University of Florida and its contractors are qualified to carry out and complete the construction and equipping of the Project.
- The authorizations provided by this Ordinance are for (f) public uses and purposes for which the City may use its powers as a

county, municipality and as a political subdivision of the State of Florida and may expend public funds, and the necessity in the public interest for the provisions herein enacted is hereby declared as a matter of legislative determination.

(g) This Ordinance is adopted pursuant to the provisions of Chapters 163, 166 and 125, Florida Statutes, as amended, the City's Charter, and other applicable provisions of law.

Section 2. Appropriation. For the 2022-2023 fiscal year, within the City's budget, there are hereby appropriated the indicated sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) listed in subsection (b): (Revised B.T. 23-056, attached hereto as Revised Exhibit 2, labeled as "Revised Exhibit 2, Rev B.T. 23-056, March 6, 2023 - NCSPHS" and incorporated herein by this reference):

(c) Explanation of Appropriation

The funding above appropriates up to \$20,000,000 from the City's Commercial Paper Facility and/or the issuance of fixed rate debt to provide a grant to the University of Florida for the creation of a Health and Financial Technology Graduate Education Center within the City.

Section 3. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 2 is to appropriate funding for a City grant in the amount of \$20,000,000, to be disbursed on a 50/50 basis with other funding identified by the University, for the capital needs of the University in creating a Health and Financial Technology Graduate Education Center within the City.

Section 4. Carryover. The funds appropriated in this Ordinance shall not lapse but shall carryover to fiscal year

2023-2024.

Ordinance, to replace the Fourth Revised Schedule B4 to allow funding for the University of Florida Fintech Graduate Education Center project. 2022-504-E, the FY 2022-2023 Budget Ordinance, is hereby amended to replace the Fourth Revised Schedule B4, entitled "FY 22-23 Debt Management Fund Detail," in order to allow for the funding by the City of the University of Florida Health and Financial Technology Graduate Education Center project as authorized herein. The Fifth Revised Schedule B4 is attached hereto as Revised Exhibit 3, labeled as "Revised Exhibit 3, 5th Rev Schedule B4, March 6, 2023 - NCSPHS".

Section 6. Authorizing the Borrowing and Appropriation of Funds from the City's Commercial Paper Program. The City is hereby authorized to borrow under its Commercial Paper Program and/or issue fixed-rate debt in the maximum amount of up to \$20,000,000 and such funds are hereby appropriated to fund a portion of the Project, consistent with the Agreement, defined below. The authorization set forth in this Section is subject to the requirements and prerequisites of the Commercial Paper Program and/or bond programs.

The City is hereby authorized to negotiate and enter into an Agreement with the University of Florida ("Agreement") substantially in accordance with the term sheet attached hereto as Second Revised Exhibit 1, for the purposes of providing the City Grant funds to partially fund the Project in conjunction with other financial sources. The City's disbursement of City funds for the Project is conditioned upon approval of the Project and the terms and conditions outlined in Second Revised Exhibit 1 by the University's Board of Trustees as evidenced by the University's execution of the Agreement prior to City execution.

funding through a competitive evaluated award process), Part 1 (General Provisions), Chapter 118 (City Grants), Ordinance Code. The provisions of Section 118.107 (Nonprofits to receive funding through a competitive evaluated award process), Part 1 (General Provisions), Chapter 118 (City Grants), Ordinance Code, are hereby waived to allow for a direct contract between the University of Florida Board of Trustees and the City of Jacksonville. The City finds that the direct contract approved herein is justified because the Project will provide economic benefits to the City and its residents and promotes and furthers the public interests and the public and municipal purposes of the City.

Section 9. Oversight Department. The Finance and Administration Department shall provide oversight for the Agreement authorized herein.

Section 10. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
