A RESOLUTION GRANTING THE APPEAL OF A FINAL ORDER OF THE JACKSONVILLE HISTORIC PRESERVATION COMMISSION DENYING APPLICATION FOR CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATENESS COA-22-28217, AS REQUESTED BY KIMBERLY SIMON BAKER, SEEKING APPROVAL TO REPLACE AN EXISTING SHINGLE ROOF WITH A SILVER METAL ROOF (REROOF) ON A CONTRIBUTING STRUCTURE IN THE RIVERSIDE/AVONDALE HISTORIC DISTRICT AT 1968 MORNINGSIDE STREET (R.E. NO. 092736-0000) IN COUNCIL DISTRICT 14, PURSUANT TO CHAPTER 307 (HISTORIC PRESERVATION AND PROTECTION), PART 2 (APPELLATE PROCEDURE), ORDINANCE CODE; ADOPTING RECOMMENDED FINDINGS AND CONCLUSIONS OF THE LAND USE AND ZONING COMMITTEE; PROVIDING FOR NOTICE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Kimberly Simon Baker, owner of property located at 1968 Morningside Street in the Riverside/Avondale Historic District in Council District 14 (the "Subject Property"), submitted Application for Certificate of Appropriateness COA-22-28217 requesting to replace an existing shingle roof with a silver metal roof (reroof) on a contributing structure located on the Subject Property; and

WHEREAS, by Final Order dated November 15, 2022, the Jacksonville Historic Preservation Commission denied Application for Certificate of Appropriateness COA-22-28217, requesting to replace an existing shingle roof with a silver metal roof (reroof) on a contributing structure; and

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WHEREAS, on December 5, 2022, pursuant to Section 307.201, Ordinance Code, Ian Baker, on behalf of Kimberly Simon Baker, filed a Notice of Appeal appealing the Jacksonville Historic Preservation Commission's Final Order denying Application for Certificate of Appropriateness COA-22-28217; and

WHEREAS, the Notice of Appeal was timely filed and the appellant has standing to appeal; now, therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Adoption of recommended findings and conclusions. The Council has reviewed the record of proceedings for the Appeal of the Final Order denying Application for Certificate of Appropriateness COA-22-28217. The record of proceedings is On File in the City Council Legislative Services Division and the Planning and Development Department. After reviewing the record proceedings, the recommended findings and conclusions of the Land Use and Zoning Committee are hereby adopted by the Council. Based on the competent, substantial evidence in the record of proceedings, the appeal is granted, the Historic Preservation Commission Final Order denying Application for Certificate of Appropriateness COA-22-28217 is overturned, and Application for Certificate of Appropriateness COA-22-28217 is approved. Pursuant to Section 166.033, Florida Statutes, the Council hereby finds:

- (1) This Resolution shall serve as written notice of the Council's action to grant the appeal and approve COA-22-28217 to the appellant, Ian Baker, and the applicant for Certificate of Appropriateness COA-22-28217, Kimberly Simon Baker.
- (2) Based on a review and application of the criteria listed in Section 307.106, Ordinance Code, pertaining to requests for alterations to a contributing structure within a historic district, and the competent, substantial evidence in the record of proceedings, Application for Certificate of Appropriateness COA-22-28217

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sufficiently demonstrates a basis for granting the request for alterations to the subject contributing structure located in the Riverside/Avondale Historic District. This Resolution is the final action of the Council.

Section 2. Notice. Legislative Services is hereby directed to mail a copy of this Resolution, as adopted, to the appellant, applicant for Certificate of Appropriateness COA-22-28217, and any other parties who testified before the Land Use and Zoning Committee, or who otherwise filed a qualifying written statement as defined in Section 307.202(c), Ordinance Code.

Section 3. Effective Date. The adoption of this Resolution shall be deemed to constitute a quasi-judicial action of the City Council and shall become effective upon the signature by the Council President and Council Secretary.
