5 AN ORDINANCE REGARDING CHAPTER 745 (ADDRESSING 6 AND STREET NAMING REGULATIONS), ORDINANCE CODE; 7 ESTABLISHING AN HONORARY STREET DESIGNATION AND ASSOCIATED ROADWAY MARKERS FOR WALTER W. 8 9 FLOWERS, A FALLEN FIRE AND RESCUE OFFICER WHO DIED WHILE IN THE LINE OF DUTY; ESTABLISHING AN 10 HONORARY STREET DESIGNATION ON ATLANTIC BLVD. AT 11 THE CORNER OF SAN MARCO PLACE AND ATLANTIC BLVD. 12 AND EXTENDING EAST TO THE CITY-OWNED RIGHT OF 13 14 WAY BEFORE THE RAILROAD CROSSING IN COUNCIL 15 DISTRICT 5 FOR WALTER W. FLOWERS; PROVIDING FOR THE ROADSIDE MARKERS FOR WALTER W. FLOWERS TO BE 16 DEPICTED AS CONTEMPLATED IN SECTION 745.105 17 (J) (9) (B), ORDINANCE CODE; PROVIDING FOR THE 18 INSTALLATION OF TWO HONORARY ROADWAY MARKERS TO 19 BE LOCATED IN APPROPRIATE LOCATIONS ON THE 20 DESIGNATED ROADWAY IN COUNCIL DISTRICT 5; WAIVER 21 OF SECTION 745.102(I)(3), ORDINANCE CODE, WHICH 22 23 REQUIRES THE HONOREE TO LIVE WITHIN 5 MILES OF 24 THE DESIGNATED ROADWAY FOR 10 YEARS; DIRECTING 25 THE LEGISLATIVE SERVICES DIVISION TO FORWARD 26 THIS ORDINANCE TO THE PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT 27 DEPARTMENT FOR PROCESSING, IMPLEMENTATION, AND 28 COORDINATION WITH THE PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT, 29 TRAFFIC ENGINEERING AND OTHER AFFECTED AGENCIES AND ORGANIZATIONS; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE. 30

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WHEREAS, the Jacksonville Fire and Rescue Department (JFRD) submitted a request for an Honorary Street Name Designation to honor Fire and Rescue Walter W. Flowers; (An email from the City of Jacksonville Fire and Rescue Department is attached hereto as **Exhibit** 1); and

6 WHEREAS, Section 745.105 (j) (9) (b), Ordinance Code, provides for 7 honorary designations for fallen fire and rescue officers who die 8 while in the Line of Duty; and

9 WHEREAS, on December 25, 1968, Firefighter Flowers died while 10 in the Line of Duty when he was thrown from Engine 13 after the fire 11 truck was struck by a Florida East Coast train at an Atlantic 12 Boulevard railroad crossing; and

WHEREAS, at the time of the accident, Engine 13 was en route to a Southside fire, and Mr. Flowers was riding on the tailboard. Three other firefighters were injured in the accident; and

16 WHEREAS, he was a firefighter for a short time before his death; 17 and

18 WHEREAS, the Florida Joint Council of Fire and Emergency 19 Services honored Walter Flowers's name on the Memorial Wall at the 20 Florida Fallen Firefighter Memorial in Ocala, Florida and at the 21 State Capitol (See attached Exhibit 1); and

WHEREAS, the City of Jacksonville Fire and Rescue Department recognized the memory of Mr. Flowers on its Line of Duty Deaths webpage; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 745.105 (j)(10), Ordinance Code, the Planning and Development Department mailed written notifications on January 13, 2023, and on February 13, 2023, to 14 affected property owners requesting that the affected property owners indicate their written consent or objection to the proposed honorary street designation. Copies of the January 13, 2023, and February 13, 2023, letters are attached as **Exhibit 2** and **Exhibit 3**; and

WHEREAS, two affected property owners consented to the proposed honorary street designation. Copies of the property owners' written consents are attached as Exhibit 4; and

WHEREAS, the remaining 12 affected property owners failed to
respond to the January 12 and February 13 letters from the Planning
and Development Department; and

7 WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 745.105 (j)(10), Ord. Code, 8 affected property owners who fail to respond within 60 days of the 9 City's first written notification shall be deemed to have consented 10 to the proposed honorary street designation; and

WHEREAS, the Council finds that Walter W. Flowers is worthy and deserving of a form of recognition that the City of Jacksonville and Walter W. Flowers' family, friends and colleagues can share and celebrate in, to wit: the creation of an honorary street designation and the installation of two appropriate honorary roadway markers on Atlantic Blvd. in Council District 5; now therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

18 Section 1. Atlantic Blvd. to receive an honorary street 19 designation for Walter W. Flowers. Atlantic Blvd in Council District 20 5 starting from the corner of Atlantic Blvd. and San Marco Place 21 extending east to the City-owned Right Of Way before the railroad 22 crossing shall hereby be designated as contemplated by Section 23 745.105, Ordinance Code, for Walter W. Flowers. A map of the road 24 designation is attached hereto as Exhibit 5.

Section 2. Honorary Roadside Markers for Walter W. Flowers to be depicted as authorized in Section 745.105 (j)(9) (a)-(b), *Ordinance Code*. Two honorary roadside markers shall depict the appropriate badge and/or emblem color for Walter W. Flowers as contemplated in Section 745.105 (j)(9)(a)-(b), *Ordinance Code*, to read as follows:

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Fire and Rescue Officer

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## Walter W. Flowers

## End of Watch

## December 25, 1968

Section 3. Honorary Roadside Markers for Walter W. Flowers to be installed. Two honorary roadside markers, as contemplated by Section 745.105, Ordinance Code, recognizing and honoring Walter W. Flowers shall be placed in appropriate locations at the corner of San Marco Place and Atlantic Blvd. and extending east to the City-owned Right Of Way before the Atlantic Blvd. railroad crossing.

Section 4. Waiver of Section 745.105(i)(3), Ordinance Code.
Section 745.105(i)(3), Ordinance Code, which requires that the honoree live within 5 miles of the designated road for 10 years is hereby waived because the honoree was assigned to work at Station 13 which is located on the designated roadway.

15 Section 5. Directing Legislative Services to forward a copy 16 to the Planning and Development Department. The Chief of Legislative 17 Services is requested to send a copy of this legislation, once 18 enacted, to the Planning and Development Department, Addressing Unit, 19 for processing, implementation, and coordination with the Public 20 Works Department, Traffic Engineering Division and other affected 21 agencies and organizations.

Section 6. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
