## ORDINANCE 2023-151-E

ORDINANCE HONORING AND RECOGNIZING ΑN ACHIEVEMENTS OF HOWARD I. KORMAN IN SERVING THE CHILDREN AND YOUTH OF THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE BY NAMING THE BOARD ROOM ON THE SECOND FLOOR OF THE KIDS HOPE ALLIANCE BUILDING, LOCATED AT 1095 PHILIP RANDOLPH BOULEVARD, JACKSONVILLE, FLORIDA 32206, THE "HOWARD I. KORMAN BOARD ROOM"; WAIVING SECTION 122.102 (A) (NAMING OF AND SIGNAGE ON PUBLIC FACILITIES REGULATED), ORDINANCE CODE, REGARDING THE NAMING OF PUBLIC FACILITIES AFTER LIVING PEOPLE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Howard I. Korman is the true definition of a community steward, and his commitment to the children and youth of the City of Jacksonville spans decades of generations of families who may not know his name, may not have ever met him, but should know that their lives are better today because Mr. Korman cares so deeply about those in need; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Korman has always felt strongly about improving the quality of early literacy and the learning services for Jacksonville's youngest citizens paying special attention to children and youth living in low-income neighborhoods; and

WHEREAS, one leading example of Mr. Korman's unwavering commitment to children and youth was his time, talent, and dedication

 he gave while he served on the board of The Early Learning Coalition ("ELC") for two terms being very involved in developing the Central Agency for the ELC and being very instrumental on creating a "Quality Rating System"; and

WHEREAS, while serving on the ELC board, Mr. Korman became involved on the Mayor's Jacksonville Early Literacy Partnership also known as "JELP"; and

WHEREAS, during Mr. Korman's tenure with JELP, he exhibited the courage to do what was right for our children and youth, unyielding energy, unparalleled intelligence and talent beyond belief, and a drive to realize the JELP shared vision that "every child enter kindergarten ready to read, ready to learn, and ready to succeed!"; and

WHEREAS, as a long-time leading advocate for children and youth, Mr. Korman also was one of the first leaders in Jacksonville to stand up and say Jacksonville needed a focused commission that served the children and youth of Jacksonville - no matter what neighborhood they came from, what their family's status in the community was, or what their need was - great or small; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Korman stood next to such great leaders as former Mayor Ed Austin to lead Jacksonville forward by creating the Jacksonville Children's Commission in 1994, where he eventually served on the board and chaired it, taking it to a level of excellence that was modeled around the state of Florida and the nation; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Korman was also instrumental in working with Mayor Lenny Curry, other City leaders, and non-profits to revamp the Jacksonville Children's Commission by forming a new City agency known as Kids Hope Alliance, the lead City agency responsible for implementing a comprehensive and integrated system of essential programs and services to address the critical needs of children and youth; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Korman was also recognized through his work with children and families across Jacksonville, and he was one of the first to shed light on a crisis looming in our city that was not receiving the attention that it deserved: that of the infant mortality rate; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Korman chaired an important task force organized by Jacksonville Community Council, Inc. (JCCI) to not only study the high infant mortality rate issue, but implement policies and programs to address this tragic situation, and because of Mr. Korman's ability to turn from thought to action to results many lives of children have been spared; and

WHEREAS, today, many people across our community rally and support issues related to those in need - especially our most vulnerable - but Mr. Korman did more than talk about the sorrows and the woes of those in need, he stood tall and rallied those in powerful positions to make things happen; and

WHEREAS, it can truly be said that but for Howard I. Korman, Jacksonville's children and youth would not be receiving the attention, commitment, and resources this community places on them today; and

WHEREAS, in honor of Mr. Korman's long career of service to the children and youth of the City of Jacksonville, the Mayor, the City Council, and Kids Hope Alliance desire to name the Kids Hope Alliance board room on the second floor of the Kids Hope Alliance building located at 1095 A. Philip Randolph Boulevard, Jacksonville, Florida 32206, the "Howard I. Korman Board Room"; and

WHEREAS, a copy of the Kids Hope Alliance board resolution from its meeting held on February 22, 2023, is attached hereto as Exhibit 1; now therefore

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Recitals. The recitals above are true and

correct and incorporated herein by this reference.

I. Korman Board Room". The Kids Hope Alliance board room on the second floor of the Kids Hope Alliance building located at 1095 A. Philip Randolph Boulevard, Jacksonville, Florida 32206, is hereby named the "Howard I. Korman Board Room" in honor and recognition of Mr. Korman's decades long career of service to the children and youth of the City of Jacksonville.

Section 3. Waiver of Section 122.102(a), Ordinance Code. Section 122.102(a) (Naming of and signage on public facilities regulated), Ordinance Code, prohibiting a public facility in the City from being named after any living person, is hereby waived to allow for the board room referenced in Section 2 above to be named in honor of Howard I. Korman, a living person.

Section 4. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
