RESOLUTION 2023-219-A

A RESOLUTION STRONGLY OPPOSING THE PASSAGE OF HOUSE BILL 1331 AND SENATE BILL 1380 WHICH WOULD PROVIDE FOR A NOT-TO-EXCEED CAP ON THE TRANSFERS OF MUNICIPAL ELECTRIC, NATURAL GAS, WATER, AND WASTEWATER UTILITY REVENUES TO A MUNICIPAL GENERAL FUND TO FINANCE GENERAL GOVERNMENT FUNCTIONS; DIRECTING LEGISLATIVE SERVICES TO CIRCULATE THIS RESOLUTION TO THE FLORIDA LEGISLATURE; REQUESTING EMERGENCY PASSAGE UPON INTRODUCTION; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, JEA is an independent authority within the consolidated City of Jacksonville that is authorized to own, manage, and operate a utilities system that currently includes electric, water, wastewater, and district energy services; and

WHEREAS, a number of municipal utilities throughout the state contribute to their respective municipal general funds as a means to support the operations of government, recognizing that such contributions allow the ratepayers to realize a secondary but meaningful benefit from funds paid for utility services; and

WHEREAS, in recognition of the unique, symbiotic relationship between the City and JEA, JEA makes an annual contribution to the City's general fund in support of general governmental functions and

operations of the consolidated City of Jacksonville, including public safety and emergency services, parks and recreation programming and services, library services, local services and programs designed to mitigate costs and utility disruptions to customers who are neighbors in Jacksonville, and other operational services and expenses that may be paid using general fund dollars; and

WHEREAS, the JEA contribution to the City's general fund for fiscal year 2022-2023 totaled \$122,424,496 and supported a multitude of programs and services enjoyed by the City's residents and visitors alike; and

WHEREAS, House Bill 1331 and Senate Bill 1380 were introduced at the state level this legislative session and in their current proposed form as of the date of adoption of this Resolution, as substituted in Committee and proposed to be amended, respectively, would allow the state to set a not-to-exceed cap on transfers of municipal electric, natural gas, water, and wastewater utility revenues to a municipal general fund by dictating a limitation on the amount of such general fund contributions; and

WHEREAS, the Council finds that the potential harm to the City of Jacksonville and JEA is sufficient that the Council should inform the Florida Legislature that it is opposed to House Bill 1331 and Senate Bill 1380 and urges the Florida Legislature to defeat both bills; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

to House Bill 1331 and Senate Bill 1380. The City Council strongly opposes and urges the Florida Legislature to defeat passage of House Bill 1331 and Senate Bill 1380 which would, together or individually, provide for a not-to-exceed cap on the transfers of municipal electric, natural gas, water, or wastewater revenues to a municipal general fund to finance general government functions. This action

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would only serve to further hamstring a local government's ability to effectively utilize its financial resources to provide the programs and services it deems most appropriate to meet the needs of its community.

Direction to the Chief of Legislative Services Section 2. The Chief of Legislative Services Division is hereby Division. directed to provide a copy of this Resolution to the Florida Legislature, the Duval County Legislative Delegation, the Senate President, and the Speaker of the House.

Section 3. Requesting Emergency Passage Upon Introduction Pursuant to Council Rule 4.901 Emergency. Emergency passage upon introduction of this legislation is requested. The nature of the emergency is that these bills are currently moving through the state legislative process and the Council would like to notify the Florida Legislature of its strong opposition to both HB 1331 and SB 1380, in their current proposed form as of the date of adoption of this Resolution, before final action is taken.

Effective Date. This Resolution shall become Section 4. effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
