AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$114,822.83 IN CIVIL FINES AND PENALTIES REVENUE FROM THE LITTER TRUST FUND, AND APPROPRIATING 70 PERCENT OF SUCH REVENUE TO THE JACKSONVILLE TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY (JTA) TO KEEP PUBLIC BUS STOPS AND PUBLIC BUS SHELTERS WELL-MAINTAINED AND LITTER FREE, AND THE REMAINING 30 PERCENT TO THE NEIGHBORHOODS DEPARTMENT, MUNICIPAL COMPLIANCE DIVISION, TO PAY PERSONNEL COSTS FOR PART-TIME CODE ENFORCEMENT EMPLOYEES TO CONDUCT PUBLIC RIGHT-OF-WAY ENFORCEMENT OF SNIPE SIGNS AND PUBLIC AWARENESS AND EDUCATION PROGRAMS TO ADVANCE ZERO-TOLERANCE FOR LITTER, AS INITIATED BY B.T. 23-060; REQUIRING A REPORT TO CITY COUNCIL; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Appropriation. For the 2022-2023 fiscal year, within the City's budget, there is hereby appropriated the indicated sum from the account listed in subsection (a) to the account listed in subsection (b):

(c) Explanation of Appropriation:

The funding above is an appropriation of civil fines and penalties in the amount of \$114,822.83 from the Litter Trust Fund, in accordance with Section 111.786, Ordinance Code. This revenue will fund public bus stop and bus shelter maintenance and litter control activities by the Jacksonville Transportation Authority (JTA) as well as public right-of-way snipe sign enforcement and public awareness and education programs by part-time City code enforcement employees within the Neighborhoods Department, Municipal Code Compliance Division.

Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to provide for the authorized expenditure of the civil fines and penalties revenue deposited in the Litter Trust Fund. Pursuant to Section 111.786, Ordinance Code, 70 percent (\$80,375.98) of the revenue will be used by JTA to keep public bus stops and public bus shelters well maintained and litter free, in the manner set forth in written criteria adopted by JTA for that purpose. The remaining 30 percent (\$34,446.85) will be used to pay part-time code enforcement employees for public right-of-way enforcement of snipe signs and to conduct public awareness and education programs to advance zero-tolerance for litter.

Section 3. Report to the City Council. The Chief of the Municipal Code Compliance Division shall provide an annual report to the City Council concerning the utilization of Litter Trust Fund funds, including therein the nature of public awareness and education programs to advance zero-tolerance of litter, the status of enforcement efforts, and staffing levels and needs.

Section 4. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
