**Type of Action:** Establishing Public Service Grant Council FY 23-24 Categories of Most Vulnerable Persons and Needs

**Bill Summary:** This bill establishes the FY 23-24 categories of Most Vulnerable Persons and Needs for the Public Service Grant Council. One cycle emergency passage is requested due to the requirement in Section 118.804, *Ordinance Code* that sets a deadline of May 1<sup>st</sup> to establish the categories.

**Background Information:** The Public Service Grant Council met on February 13, 2023, to approve the fiscal year 2023-2024 categories of Most Vulnerable Persons and Needs. The purpose of this legislation is to identify the following categories and percentages to be used exclusively for Public Service Grants:

- Priority Need A: Acute (30%) Services focused on adult individuals and/or families experiencing a difficult or dangerous situation which requires prompt action to avoid further deterioration of their health, safety, or welfare.
- Priority Need B: Prevention and Diversion (40%) Services focused on preventing negative changes to the health, safety, and welfare of adult individuals and/or families; or services designed to divert adult individuals and/or families who have experienced negative changes to their health, safety, or welfare from experiencing further deterioration.
- Priority Need C: Self-Sufficiency and Stability (30%) Services focused on helping adult individuals and/or families work toward needing no assistance to satisfy their health, safety, and welfare; or services focused on helping adult individuals and/or families work towards a stable level of assistance needed on an ongoing basis.
- Priority Need D: Micro-Grant Pilot Program (0%) This pilot program would be funded separately from the normal PSG Council Award/ Budget process. The procedures and requirements would be part of separate legislation.

Policy Impact Area: Public Service Grant Council - Most Vulnerable Persons and Needs

Fiscal Impact: No direct cost to the City; establishes the categories for later expenditures
