AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING A \$2,000,000 GRANT FROM THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE, OFFICE OF JUSTICE PROGRAMS, FOR THE MAYOR'S VIOLENCE REDUCTION CENTER ("MVRC") COMMUNITY-BASED VIOLENCE INTERVENTION AND PREVENTION INITIATIVE ("CVIPI"), AS INITIATED BY B.T. 23-043; AUTHORIZING POSITIONS, AS INITIATED BY R.C. 23-095; PROVIDING FOR OVERSIGHT BY THE GRANTS AND CONTRACT COMPLIANCE DIVISION; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

(c) Explanation of Appropriation:

The funding above represents a grant in the amount of

\$2,000,000 from the United States Department of Justice, Bureau of Justice Assistance, to support the Mayor's Violence Reduction Center ("MVRC") Community-Based Violence Intervention and Prevention Initiative ("CVIPI") for the purpose of crime prevention and intervention and improving public safety in Duval County. No local match is required. The grant period commenced on October 1, 2022 and continues through September 30, 2025, with opportunity for a no cost extension by the grantor.

Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to fund several positions within the Grants and Contract Compliance Division to support the MVRC CVIPI and to procure contractual services for the MVRC CVIPI as more specifically described herein. Programs funded by this grant serve to interrupt the transmission of violence in communities most affected by violent crime. The City will utilize the grant funds to align intervention activities in a community that has documented a large number of homicides and whose members have been historically underserved, marginalized, and adversely affected by inequality. In addition, the MVRC CVIPI is designed to align community violence intervention assets at a central hub, increasing protective factors and reducing shootings in one of the deadliest communities in the country.

The MVRC CVIPI will also serve to expand and enhance the City's current violent crime intervention strategy, Cure Violence. This federal grant funding will unify the three existing Cure Violence Jacksonville sites and other community-wide violence intervention efforts at the MVRC. This effort will also link individual victims of transgenerational violence with assessments, referrals for wraparound services, education, workforce training and placement, and follow-up services for up to one year. Participants will learn family-sustaining lifestyles and vocational skills. Copies of the
