ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$332,229.55 ΑN ΤN ADDITIONAL AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT GRANT FUNDING RECEIVED FROM THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF SERVICES AND HEALTH AND HUMAN DISTRIBUTED THROUGH NORTHEAST FLORIDA AREA AGENCY ON AGING, INC., D/B/A ELDERSOURCE, IN SUPPORT OF JACKSONVILLE SENIOR SERVICES PROGRAM, AS INITIATED BY B.T. 23-078; PROVIDING FOR OVERSIGHT AND REPORTING BY THE SENIOR SERVICES DIVISION OF THE PARKS, RECREATION AND COMMUNITY SERVICES DEPARTMENT; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

 - American Rescue Plan Act grant funding from the U.S.

Department of Health and Human Services, distributed through Northeast Florida Area Agency on Aging, Inc., d/b/a ElderSource, in the amount of \$332,229.55, for continued support of the Jacksonville Senior Services Program (the "Program"). The extended grant period commences July 11, 2022, and continues through September 30, 2024. No City match is required to receive these additional grant funds.

Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to provide additional funding to support the goals and objectives of the Program. Program efforts include providing supportive services, nutrition services, and preventive health services to family caregivers in response to coronavirus, giving preference to older individuals (ages 60 and older) with greatest economic and social needs. Crisis assistance may include, but is not limited to, COVID-19 vaccination outreach, education, aiding older adults with vaccinations, and other associated services; as well as resources addressing social isolation, including activities for investments in technological equipment, to facilitate these efforts.

A copy of the ElderSource Standard Contract American Rescue Plan Act (Agreement Number: RP21-JSSP), together with Amendment One effective September 1, 2021, and Amendment Two effective January 1, 2023, setting forth the terms and conditions relative to receipt and expenditure of the aforementioned grant funds, has been placed **On File** with the Office of Legislative Services.

Section 3. Oversight Department. The Senior Services Division of the Parks, Recreation and Community Services Department shall oversee administration of the grant described herein.

Section 4. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
