Consistent with Chapter 745 of the Jacksonville Ordinance Code on addressing and street naming regulations, requests to rename streets require a review and recommendation from the Jacksonville Historic Preservation Commission. In making a report and recommendation, the Commission shall address the following criteria:

- 2. Any historical significance of the existing street name
- 3. Whether there are any historical structures or landmarks on the subject street
- 4. Whether the existing name is part of a common theme of street names throughout the community where such street is located
- 5. The age of the street name
- 6. Whether the street name is a duplicate street name

# Reason for Change:

The request for the name change is to pay homage to the school mascot and enhance student culture at Atlantic Coast High School. The change would only rename a portion of R.G. Skinner Parkway.

#### Analysis:

R.G. Skinner Parkway is named after medical pioneer and public servant Dr. Richard G. Skinner, Jr. A lifelong advocate of pediatric health, Dr. Skinner was known for developing successful strategies to identify early learning disabilities in children and adolescents.

The entire segment of R.G. Skinner Parkway currently spans over 1.4± miles in length between Baymeadows Road East and the northern terminus of E-Town Parkway. The street was constructed in two phases: phase one was completed in 2005 and phase two was completed in 2011.

The request for the name change only applies to the southern portion of R.G. Skinner Parkway, as described in Plat Book 65, Page 118-119, and as depicted in the location map. The northern portion of R.G. Skinner Parkway, as described in Plat Book 55, Pages 55-55B, will not be renamed.

No historic structures or landmarks have been identified along this portion of the subject street, and the existing road name is not part of a common theme of street names in the area, nor is it a duplicate street name.

According to supporting documentation, private agreements are being facilitated in order to honor the life and legacy of Richard Green Skinner Jr. and his family's impact on the area.

#### Recommendation:

Based on the best evidence available, the Planning and Development Department has no objection to the proposed street name change from R.G. Skinner Parkway to Stingray Parkway and Stingray Way as depicted in the location map.






