A RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING AND COMMENDING THE NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF LETTER CARRIERS 31ST ANNUAL "STAMP OUT HUNGER" FOOD DRIVE OCCURRING ON MAY 13, 2023, AND URGING THE JACKSONVILLE COMMUNITY TO TAKE PART BY LEAVING NON-PERISHABLE FOOD DONATIONS BY THEIR MAILBOX ON SATURDAY, MAY 13TH; REQUESTING EMERGENCY PASSAGE UPON INTRODUCTION; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, currently there are more than 42 million Americans who are unsure where their next meal will come from, of which more than 12 million are children who feel hunger's impact on their overall health and ability to perform in school; and

WHEREAS, nearly 5.2 million seniors over age 60 are food insecure, with many who live on fixed incomes often required to make a choice between paying for medication or purchasing food; and

WHEREAS, the National Association of Letter Carriers ("NALC") National Food Drive is the outgrowth of a long-standing tradition of community service exhibited repeatedly by members of the letter carrier union over the years; and

country visit WHEREAS, letter carriers throughout the neighborhoods in every town six (now seven) days a week and have made it their mission to get involved in helping their communities, whether it be collecting funds for charities such as the Muscular Dystrophy

Association, watching over the elderly through the Carrier Alert program, assisting the American Red Cross during times of disaster, or rescuing victims of fires, crimes, and other mishaps; and

WHEREAS, for many years, several branches of the NALC have collected food for those in need as part of their community service efforts by making additional runs on their routes after hours; and

WHEREAS, the national coordinated effort by the NALC to help fight hunger in America began in October of 1991 when a pilot food drive was held in ten cities throughout the country, with the City of Jacksonville proudly included amongst the original ten participating cities; and

WHEREAS, the pilot food drive proved to be so successful that work commenced immediately to make it a nationwide effort and over the course of its 30-year history the NALC food drive has collected over 1.82 billion pounds of food for those in need; and

WHEREAS, the NALC food drive occurs annually on the second Saturday in May, and this year the 31st Annual "Stamp Out Hunger" Food Drive will occur on May 13, 2023, when letter carriers across the country will collect non-perishable food donations that will go directly to several local food pantries; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. The City Council hereby recognizes and commends the National Association of Letter Carriers on its 31st Annual "Stamp Out Hunger" Food Drive as our letter carriers fight to assist citizens in meeting one of the most basic human needs. The Council urges members of the Jacksonville community to take part in the NALC's Food Drive by placing non-perishable food donations in a bag by their mailboxes on Saturday, May 13th.

Section 2. Requesting Emergency Passage Upon Introduction

Pursuant to Council Rule 4.901. Emergency passage upon introduction

of this Resolution is requested in order to recognize the 31st Annual

"Stamp Out Hunger" Food Drive which occurs on May 13, 2023, in a timely manner.
