BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Appropriation. For the 2023-2024 fiscal year, within the City's budget, there is hereby appropriated the indicated sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) listed in subsection (b):

(c) Explanation of Appropriation:

The funding above is an appropriation of \$572,658.00 in annual grant funds from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development ("HUD") for the Emergency Solutions Grant

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30 31 ("ESG") program. The City is required to match ESG funds with an equal amount of cash and/or non-cash contributions which may include donated buildings, materials, and volunteer services. The City accomplishes this match requirement through programs and funding provided by the Social Services Division of the Parks, Recreation and Community Services Department. The ESG program grant funds must be expended within 24 months after HUD signs the grant agreement.

Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to provide funding for services and activities aimed at addressing homelessness and that meet ESG program goals objectives. This includes activities and services that: i) engage homeless individuals and families living on the street; ii) improve the number and quality of emergency shelters for homeless individuals and families; iii) help operate these shelters; iv) provide essential services to shelter residents; v) rapidly re-house homeless individuals and families; and vi) prevent individuals and families from becoming homeless. A portion of the ESG funds will be used for costs associated with administration of the ESG program. The Schedule of Proposed Funding detailing the proposed uses of ESG funds is attached hereto as **Exhibit 2** and incorporated herein by this reference.

Section 3. Authorization for Reallocation of Grant Funds. In the event a sub-recipient is unable or unwilling to accept an award of ESG funds, the funds may be reallocated to the next eligible awardee using the same method and criteria normally applied by the Jacksonville Housing and Community Development Commission for award of ESG funds.

Section 4. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective

without the Mayor's signature.
