A RESOLUTION HONORING AND COMMEMORATING THE 100TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE MANDARIN COMMUNITY CLUB AND ITS CENTURY OF SERVICE AND CONTRIBUTIONS TO THE MANDARIN COMMUNITY AND JACKSONVILLE'S QUALITY OF LIFE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, in 1916, civic-minded and patriotic 11 Mandarin residents founded the Mandarin Liberty League prior to the nation's 12 1917 entry into World War I and created projects to assist in the 13 nation's war effort through the promotion of liberty loan drives and 14 15 patriotic parades, as well as support for increased food production in rural Mandarin; and 16

WHEREAS, on July 2, 1923, several years after the war's conclusion, the Liberty League decided to change its name to the Mandarin Community Club to reflect its evolving mission to serve Mandarin's civic and cultural concerns. The newly formed club elected officers, selecting the same individuals who served in the Liberty League; and

23 WHEREAS, in its earliest years, the club focused on improving 24 roads and securing electricity for the community, eventually 25 succeeding when Mandarin celebrated the arrival of electric access 26 on June 5, 1936; and in 1938 the club took ownership of the half-27 century old Mandarin School, built through the efforts of celebrated 2.8 author Harriet Beecher Stowe, and the club has since restored and 29 maintained the historic school, now known as the Mandarin Community Club; and 30

WHEREAS, in the club's 100 year history its contributions

include: protecting and promoting Mandarin's natural environment; 1 2 hosting thousands of community meetings, programs and events; founding, supporting and housing Mandarin's first library; publishing 3 Mandarin history, including the revered books Mandarin on the St. 4 5 Johns and Palmetto Leaves; organizing blood drives dating back 70 years; establishing the Mandarin Art Festival in 1968; purchasing the 6 7 Mandarin Post Office and Store, now a museum and a National Register Site; protecting the line of Patriarch Oak trees along Mandarin Road; 8 9 establishing the Billard Commemorative Park to recognize area 10 veterans; acquiring the Sisters of St. Joseph "one-room" School as a gift to the community; holding an annual tree giveaway; and 11 celebrating the December holidays with a community tree lighting on 12 the club's historic properties; and 13

14 WHEREAS, the club has originated and housed many Mandarin 15 groups, including the Mandarin Volunteer Fire Department; the 16 Mandarin Well Baby Clinic; the Mandarin Garden Club, the Mandarin 17 Orange Pickers Baseball Team; the Mandarin Players theater company; 18 and the Mandarin Museum and Historical Society; and

19 WHEREAS, on July 2, 2023, the Mandarin Community Club 20 celebrates its 100th anniversary; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

22 Section 1. The City of Jacksonville hereby commemorates the 23 100th anniversary of the Mandarin Community Club and recognizes the 24 club's contributions to the Mandarin community and to Jacksonville's 25 quality of life. The City Council extends its gratitude for the club's 26 century of community service.

27 Section 2. Effective Date. This Resolution shall become
28 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective
29 without the Mayor's signature.
