## ORDINANCE 2023-375

6 AN ORDINANCE REGARDING CHAPTER 307 (HISTORIC 7 PRESERVATION AND PROTECTION), ORDINANCE CODE; 8 DESIGNATING THE CHURCH BUILDING LOCATED IN 9 COUNCIL DISTRICT 7 AT 841 FRANKLIN STREET, 10 BETWEEN ODESSA STREET AND PIPPIN STREET (R.E. NO. 122578-0000), OWNED BY MOUNT OLIVE A.M.E. 11 CHURCH TRUSTEES, AS A LOCAL LANDMARK; DIRECTING 12 THE CHIEF OF LEGISLATIVE SERVICES TO NOTIFY THE 13 14 APPLICANT, THE PROPERTY OWNER, AND THE PROPERTY 15 APPRAISER OF THE LOCAL LANDMARK DESIGNATION, AND 16 TO RECORD THE LOCAL LANDMARK DESIGNATION IN THE 17 OFFICIAL RECORDS OF DUVAL COUNTY; DIRECTING THE 18 ZONING ADMINISTRATOR TO ENTER THE LOCAL LANDMARK 19 DESIGNATION ON THE ZONING ATLAS; PROVIDING AN 20 EFFECTIVE DATE.

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WHEREAS, the Jacksonville City Council (the "Council") enacted Chapter 307 (Historic Preservation and Protection), Ordinance Code, to facilitate the designation of landmarks and landmark sites, where appropriate; and

WHEREAS, the structure to be designated by this Ordinance is the church building located in Council District 7 at 841 Franklin Street, between Odessa Street and Pippin Street (R.E. No. 122578-0000), owned by Mount Olive A.M.E. Church Trustees (the "Subject Property"); and

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WHEREAS, the origin of Mount Olive A.M.E. Church dates to the

Spring of 1868 when Pastor Henry Floyd started a house of prayer in his residence at Old Hardee's Mill Quarters along the St. Johns River; and

WHEREAS, in 1887, Mount Olive A.M.E. Church moved to the current
location and a new wood-frame building was constructed to support its
rapidly growing membership; and

7 WHEREAS, in 1921 the church received a building permit to 8 remove the wood frame structure to accommodate the foundation and 9 basement of a new masonry sanctuary; as a result of a major 10 fundraising drive, in 1927 the church was able to construct the walls 11 and the roof of the auditorium in and finish the interior; and

WHEREAS, the Subject Property was designed and built by Richard Lewis Brown, recognized as the first black architect in Jacksonville, and represents the finest example of monumental Neoclassical Revival style of construction; and

16 WHEREAS, the design of the Subject Property reflects an 17 eclectic variation of the Neoclassical Revival style; and

18 WHEREAS, Mount Olive A.M.E. Church has played a significant 19 role in the Oakland community in East Jacksonville for over 150 years, 20 making it one of the oldest A.M.E. churches in the City; and

21 WHEREAS, pursuant to the requirements of Chapter 307 (Historic 22 Preservation and Protection), Ordinance Code, the Council has 23 considered the issue of designating the Subject Property as a 24 landmark, taking into consideration its importance and historical 25 value, as more fully set forth in the Designation Application, LM-23-01, and Staff Report of the Historic Preservation Section of the 26 27 Planning and Development Department, a copy of which is **On File** with the Legislative Services Division and incorporated by reference 28 29 herein (the "Application and Staff Report"); and

30 WHEREAS, all public notice and public hearing requirements
31 have been met for designating the Subject Property as a local

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landmark; and

2 WHEREAS, on May 24, 2023, the Jacksonville Historic 3 Preservation Commission reviewed and recommended approval of the 4 landmark designation; and

5 WHEREAS, the property owner is in support of the landmark 6 designation; and

7 WHEREAS, having met the requisite criteria, the Council finds 8 that it is in the best interest of the citizens of the City of 9 Jacksonville to designate the Subject Property as a local landmark, 10 in furtherance of historic preservation and protection; now, 11 therefore

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BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Designation of Local Landmark. Pursuant to
Chapter 307 (Historic Preservation and Protection), Ordinance Code,
the Council hereby designates the Subject Property, located in Council
District 7 at 841 Franklin Street, between Odessa Street and Pippin
Street (R.E. No. 122578-0000), as a local landmark.

18 Section 2. Satisfaction of Requisite Criteria. The Council 19 hereby finds that the Subject Property meets six of the requisite 20 criteria set forth in Section 307.104(j), Ordinance Code, as more 21 fully set forth in the Application and Staff Report. The six criteria 22 are as follows:

I. Its value as a significant reminder of the cultural,
 historical, architectural, or archaeological heritage of the City,
 state or nation.

26 2. It is identified with a person or persons who significantly27 contributed to the development of the City, state or nation.

3. It is identified as the work of a master builder, designer,
or architect whose individual work has influenced the development of
the City, state or nation.

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4. Its value as a building is recognized for the quality of

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1 its architecture, and it retains sufficient elements showing its 2 architectural significance.

5. It has distinguishing characteristics of an architectural style valuable for the study of a period, method of construction, or use of indigenous materials.

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6. Its suitability for preservation or restoration.

7 Section 3. Notice of Landmark Designation. Pursuant to 8 Section 307.104(m), Ordinance Code, the Council hereby directs the 9 Chief of Legislative Services, as designee of the Council Secretary, 10 to notify the applicant, the property owner, and the Property 11 Appraiser of the designation of the landmark.

Section 4. Recording of Landmark Designation. The Council
hereby directs the Chief of Legislative Services to record this
Ordinance in the official records for Duval County, Florida.

15 Section 5. Landmark Designation on Zoning Atlas. Pursuant 16 to Section 307.104(n), Ordinance Code, the Council hereby directs the 17 Zoning Administrator, as designee of the Director of the Planning and 18 Development Department, to enter the local landmark designation on 19 the Zoning Atlas, in accordance with Section 656.203, Ordinance Code.

20 Section 6. Effective Date. The enactment of this Ordinance 21 shall be deemed to constitute a quasi-judicial action of the Council 22 and therefore shall become effective upon signature by the Council 23 President and Council Secretary.
