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ORDINANCE 2023-385

AN ORDINANCE REGARDING THE FOOD WASTE DIVERSION (THE (COMPOSTING) PILOT PROGRAM "PILOT PROGRAM"); AMENDING ORDINANCE 2022-907-E, APPROVING AND ADOPTING THE PILOT PROGRAM, TO EXTEND THE PILOT PROGRAM FOR AN ADDITIONAL THREE MONTHS TO NOVEMBER 15, 2023, AND TO EXTEND THE DATE FOR A PRELIMINARY REPORT ON THE PILOT PROGRAM TO BE PRESENTED TO THE CITY COUNCIL TO DECEMBER 15, 2023; AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, OR HIS DESIGNEE, AND THE CORPORATION SECRETARY EXECUTE AN AMENDMENT TO THE CONTRACT BETWEEN THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE AND SUNSHINE ORGANICS & COMPOST LLC, TO EXTEND THE TERM OF SAID CONTRACT TO NOVEMBER 15, 2023; REQUESTING ONE CYCLE EMERGENCY PASSAGE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, on January 24, 2023, the City Council enacted Ordinance 2022-907-E approving and adopting the Food Waste Diversion (Composting) Pilot Program (the "Pilot Program") to provide a voluntary opportunity for Duval County Public Schools and various restaurants and other food-based businesses in the Riverside-Avondale area to partner with the City and its contractor, Sunshine Organics & Composting LLC, for the provision of limited composting services for certain food products; and

WHEREAS, said Ordinance provided that the Pilot Program would commence on February 15, 2023 and continue through August 15, 2023, at which point it would sunset unless further extended by legislation;

and

WHEREAS, it took longer than anticipated for the contractor and the City to finalize the logistics for operation and administration of the Pilot Program and therefore the City Council desires to extend the Pilot Program by an additional three months to November 15, 2023 so that it might be administered for a full six-month period as originally intended; now therefore

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Amending Ordinance 2022-907-E. Ordinance 2022-907-E is hereby amended to extend the term of the Pilot Program for an additional three months. The Pilot Program shall now sunset, be repealed, and be of no further effect on November 15, 2023, unless further extended by subsequent legislation. In addition, Ordinance 2022-907-E is hereby amended to extend the deadline for the Public Works Department to provide a preliminary report to the City Council regarding the Pilot Program (as outlined in Section 1 of said Ordinance) to December 15, 2023.

Section 2. Authorizing Execution of Amendment to Contract. The Mayor, or his designee, and the Corporation Secretary are hereby authorized to execute and deliver, for and on behalf of the City, an amendment to the Contract between the City of Jacksonville and Sunshine Organics & Compost LLC, to extend the term of the contract to November 15, 2023, subject to the same terms and conditions as provided therein. The Solid Waste Division of the Public Works Department shall continue to oversee and administer the contract and Pilot Program described herein.

Section 3. Requesting One Cycle Emergency Passage Pursuant to Council Rule 4.901 Emergency. One cycle emergency passage of this legislation is requested. The nature of the emergency is that the City Council would like to provide the City and contractor with as much lead time as possible to prepare for extension of the Pilot

Program and to confirm continued participation by Duval County Public Schools, restaurants and other food-based businesses for this extended period.

Section 4. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
