ΑN ORDINANCE ADOPTING AN INVENTORY LIST IDENTIFYING CITY-OWNED REAL PROPERTY DEEMED APPROPRIATE FOR USE AS AFFORDABLE HOUSING PURSUANT TO AND AS MANDATED BY SECTIONS 125.379 AND 166.0451, FLORIDA STATUTES, AND SECTION 122.423, ORDINANCE CODE; DECLARING THE 41 PARCELS ON THE INVENTORY LIST (THE "SUBJECT PARCELS") TO BE SURPLUS TO THE NEEDS OF THE CITY; AUTHORIZING DISPOSITION OF THE SUBJECT PARCELS PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 122.423 (DISPOSITION FOR AFFORDABLE HOUSING), SUBPART B (REAL PROPERTY DISPOSITIONS AND EXCHANGES), PART (REAL PROPERTY), CHAPTER 122 (PUBLIC PROPERTY), ORDINANCE CODE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Sections 125.379 and 166.0451, Florida Statutes, the City of Jacksonville/Duval County is required every three years to adopt an inventory list of all real property within its jurisdiction to which the City/County holds fee simple title that is appropriate for use as affordable housing; and

WHEREAS, Section 122.423, Ordinance Code, requires that on or before July 1, 2019, and no less often than every third year thereafter, the City Council adopt an affordable housing inventory

list; and

WHEREAS, the Council hereby adopts this Ordinance to comply with Sections 125.379 and 166.0451, Florida Statutes, and Section 122.423, Ordinance Code; now therefore

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Adoption of findings. The recitals set forth above are true and correct and are incorporated herein by this reference.

Section 2. Purpose and Adoption of Inventory List. The purpose of this Ordinance is to carry out the obligations set forth in Sections 125.379 and 166.0451, Florida Statutes, and Section 122.423, Ordinance Code, by approving and adopting an inventory list of all real property within the City of Jacksonville to which the City holds fee simple title that is appropriate for use as potential affordable housing. Therefore, the Council hereby adopts the Affordable Housing Inventory List, attached hereto as Revised Exhibit 1, labeled as "Revised Exhibit 1, Rev Inv List, June 5, 2023 - NCSPHS" and incorporated herein by this reference.

Section 3. Declaration of Surplus. The City hereby declares the 41 parcels listed on the Affordable Housing Inventory List (the "Subject Parcels") to be surplus to the needs of the City. The total "in progress" assessed value of the Subject Parcels is \$323,589.00 as determined by the Duval County Property Appraiser's Office. These assessed values are considered "in progress" as they are subject to change prior to final certification of the tax roll by the Duval County Property Appraiser.

The Real Estate Division has conducted an investigation of need as required by Section 122.422, Ordinance Code. As a result of that investigation, the Real Estate Division has determined that there is not a need for the City to allocate or convey any of the Subject Parcels to a City Agency (as that term is defined in Section 122.422,

Ordinance Code) for the agency's purposes. The Chief of the Real 1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8

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Estate Division, pursuant to Sections 122.422 and 122.423, Ordinance Code, certifies that: 1) based on the investigation, no City Agency has a need for the Subject Parcels; and 2) each of the Subject Parcels meets the affordable housing criteria set forth in Section 122.423(a), Ordinance Code. A copy of the Real Estate Certificate from the Chief of Real Estate for the surplus of real property as required by Council Rule 3.102(g)(1) (Preparation of Bills), is attached hereto as **Exhibit** 2 and incorporated herein by this reference.

Section 4. Authorizing Disposition of the Subject Parcels Pursuant to Section 122.423, Ordinance Code. The Subject Parcels shall be disposed of pursuant to the provisions of Section 122.423 (Disposition for affordable housing), Subpart B (REAL PROPERTY DISPOSITIONS AND EXCHANGES), Part 4 (REAL PROPERTY), Chapter 122 (PUBLIC PROPERTY), Ordinance Code. No further action by the City Council is necessary.

Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become Section 5. effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
