8 AN ORDINANCE REGARDING CHAPTER 745 (ADDRESSING 9 AND STREET NAMING REGULATIONS), ORDINANCE CODE; TO RE-NAME A PORTION OF "R G SKINNER 10 11 PARKWAY" BEGINNING AT THE CORNER OF THE ENTRY 12 ROAD (WHICH TURNS EASTWARD INTO THE PARKING 13 LOT OF ATLANTIC COAST HIGH SCHOOL) EXTENDING 14 NORTHBOUND TO THE RIGHT OF WAY IN FRONT OF THE 15 END OF THE STORM WATER POND TO "STINGRAY 16 PARKWAY"; TO NAME THE BUS LOOP ENTRANCE INTO 17 THE PARKING LOT OF ATLANTIC COAST HIGH SCHOOL 18 TO "STINGRAY WAY"; PROVIDING FOR INSTALLATION 19 OF А HISTORIC MONUMENT MARKER AT THE INTERSECTION OF R G SKINNER PARKWAY AND ANNIE 20 21 ELIZA ROAD IN COUNCIL DISTRICT 11 FOR RICHARD 22 GREEN SKINNER AND ANNIE ELIZA SKINNER; 23 APPROPRIATING \$4,279.60 (INCLUDING \$3,779.60 24 FROM THE COUNCIL DISTRICT 11 AUTUMN BOND 25 ACCOUNT AND A \$500.00 PRIVATE CONTRIBUTION TO 26 THE PARKS AND RECREATION DEPARTMENT 27 CONTRACTUAL SERVICES ACCOUNT) TO PROVIDE 28 FUNDING FOR THE HISTORIC MONUMENT; APPROVING, AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, OR HIS DESIGNEE, 29 30 AND THE CORPORATION SECRETARY TO EXECUTE AND 31 DELIVER, FOR AND ON BEHALF OF THE CITY, THAT

CERTAIN FUNDING AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF 1 2 JACKSONVILLE AND RAMON L. DAY; PROVIDING FOR 3 OVERSIGHT BY THE PARKS, RECREATION AND 4 COMMUNITY SERVICES AND PUBLIC WORKS 5 DEPARTMENTS; FINDING A PUBLIC PURPOSE; WAIVER OF SECTION 745.105(C), ORD. CODE; WAIVER OF 6 7 SECTION 745.105 (H), ORD. CODE; DIRECTING THE LEGISLATIVE SERVICES DIVISION TO FORWARD THIS 8 9 ORDINANCE TO THE PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT FOR PROCESSING, IMPLEMENTATION, AND 10 COORDINATION WITH THE PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT, 11 12 TRAFFIC ENGINEERING DIVISION, THE PARKS, 13 RECREATION AND COMMUNITY SERVICES DEPARTMENT, 14 911 EMERGENCY, FIRE AND RESCUE DEPARTMENT, THE 15 POST OFFICE AND OTHER AFFECTED AGENCIES AND 16 ORGANIZATIONS; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

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WHEREAS, the Planning and Development Department's Addressing Unit received an application from the applicant, the School Advisory Council for Atlantic Coast High School, to re-name a portion of "R G Skinner Parkway" to "Stingray Parkway". A copy of the application is attached as **Exhibit 1**; and

23 WHEREAS, Atlantic Coast High School is currently addressed
24 from R G Skinner Parkway; and

WHEREAS, the School Advisory Council for Atlantic Coast High School requests a street name change that correlates and matches with the name of the mascot for Atlantic Coast High School - the Stingrays"; and

WHEREAS, the applicant also seeks to name the Bus Loop entrance into the parking lot for Atlantic Coast High School to "Stingray Way"; and

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WHEREAS, the street name change from "R G Skinner Parkway" to "Stingray Parkway" affects the address assignment of one property owner who is also the applicant, School Advisory Council for the Duval County School Board; and

5 WHEREAS, on April 5, 2023, the 911 Emergency Addressing 6 Advisory Committee reviewed the street name request and voted to 7 re-name "R G Skinner Parkway" to "Stingray Parkway" as well as 8 voted to name the Bus Loop entrance into the Atlantic Coast High 9 School's parking lot to "Stingray Way". A copy of the minutes of 10 the April 5, 2023 public meeting of the 911 Emergency Addressing 11 Advisory Committee is attached as **Exhibit 2**; and

12 WHEREAS, on April 26, 2023, the Jacksonville Historic 13 Preservation Commission ("JHPC") voted to adopt the Staff Report 14 with a recommendation for approval to re-name "R G Skinner Parkway" 15 to "Stingray Parkway" as well as voted to name the Bus Loop 16 entrance into the parking lot of Atlantic Coast High School as 17 "Stingray Way" A copy of the JHPC agenda, Staff Report and the excerpt minutes of the April 26, 2023 public meeting of the 18 19 Jacksonville Historic Preservation Commission are attached hereto 20 as **Exhibit 3**; and

21 WHEREAS, the Council finds it appropriate to change a portion 22 of "R G Skinner Parkway" to "Stingray Parkway"; and

WHEREAS, as a condition to re-naming a portion of "R G Skinner Parkway" to "Stingray Parkway" the applicant and the City have agreed to fund the installation of a Historic Monument Marker in honor of Richard Green Skinner and Annie Eliza Skinner. (A copy of the Funding Agreement is attached as **Revised Exhibit 4**, labeled as "Revised Exhibit 4, Rev Funding Agrmt, June 5, 2023 - Rules"); and

WHEREAS, the Council finds that the accomplishments of the late Richard Green Skinner and Annie Eliza Skinner are worthy and deserving of a form of recognition that the City of Jacksonville

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1 and Richard Green Skinner's and Annie Eliza Skinner's descendants 2 can share and celebrate in, to wit: the creation of a historic 3 monument marker at the intersection of R G Skinner Parkway and 4 Annie Eliza Skinner Road in Council District 11; now therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

6 Section 1. A portion of R G Skinner Parkway re-named as 7 "Stingray Parkway." A portion of R G Skinner Parkway beginning at the corner of the entry road (which turns eastward into the parking 8 9 lot of Atlantic Coast High School) extending northbound to the 10 right of way in front of the end of the storm water pond is hereby 11 re-named as "Stingray Parkway" by which name such street and 12 physical location shall be hereafter known and designated. A copy 13 of the map of "Stingray Parkway" is attached hereto as Exhibit 5.

14 Section 2. Naming Bus Loop Entrance to Parking Lot as 15 "Stingray Way." The Bus Loop entrance into the parking lot of 16 Atlantic Coast High School is hereby named as "Stingray Way" by 17 which name such street and physical location shall be hereafter 18 known and designated. A copy of the map of "Stingray Way" is 19 attached hereto as Exhibit 5.

Section 3. Appropriation. For the 2022-2023 fiscal year, within the City's budget, there are hereby appropriated the indicated sum(s) for the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) listed in subsection (b): (The account information is attached hereto as **Revised Exhibit 6**, labeled as "Revised Exhibit 6, Rev B.T., June 5, 2023 - Rules" and incorporated herein by this reference)

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the amount of \$3,779.60 from the Council District 11 Autumn Bond Account and a \$500.00 private contribution to the Parks and Recreation Department Contractual Services Account to contract with a vendor for the design and creation of a Historic Monument Marker, purchase of materials and installation of a Historic Monument Marker, including maintenance costs associated with the Historic Monument Marker.

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9 Section 4. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in 10 Section 3 above is to provide a total of \$4,279.60 in funding, 11 which includes \$3,779.60 from District 11 Autumn Bond account and a 12 \$500.00 private contribution to the Parks and Recreation Department 13 Contractual Services account for the fees and materials associated 14 with the Historic Monument Marker.

15 Section 5. Approval and Authorization. There is hereby 16 approved, and the Mayor, or his designee, and the Corporation 17 Secretary are hereby authorized to execute and deliver, for and on 18 behalf of the City, that certain Funding Agreement between the City 19 of Jacksonville and Ramon L. Day, attached hereto as Revised 20 Exhibit 4 and incorporated herein by this reference. The Parks, 21 Recreation and Community Services Department shall have oversight 22 of the Funding Agreement authorized herein.

23 Section 6. Oversight/Disbursement of Funds upon 24 Invoice/Accounting/Reverter. The Mayor is requested to appoint the 25 Parks, Recreation and Community Services and the Public Works 26 Departments to oversee the design, creation and installation of the 27 Historic Monument Marker. Funds shall be disbursed only after invoices for the Historic Monument Marker have been delivered to 28 29 the Parks, Recreation and Community Services Department. Any funds 30 not utilized for the purposes set forth in this ordinance shall be returned to the fund of origin by September 30, 2023. 31

Finding of Public Purpose. 1 Section 7. The City finds 2 that the contribution of Autumn Bond discretionary funds to support 3 the historic monument marker accomplishes a public benefit by 4 providing the public with a street name that aligns with the name 5 of the mascot for Atlantic Coast High School as well as provide a historic monument marker that will be viewable to the public using 6 7 the thoroughfare.

8 Section 8. Historic Monument Marker for Richard Green 9 Skinner and Annie Eliza Skinner to be installed. A Historic 10 Monument Marker recognizing and honoring Richard Green Skinner and 11 Annie Eliza Skinner shall be placed in the appropriate location at 12 the intersection of R G Skinner Parkway and Annie Eliza Road. The 13 precise wording to be etched on the Historic Monument Marker and 14 map of the location is attached as Exhibit 7.

15 Section 9. Waiver of Section 745.105(c), Ord. Code. 16 Section 745.105 (c), Ord. Code which requires that the Planning and 17 Development Department send written notification of street name 18 changes to property owners who live on the designated street name 19 is hereby waived due to the fact that the applicant, the School 20 Advisory Council of the Duval County School Board, is the sole 21 property owner whose address will be impacted by the proposed 22 street name change.

23 Section 10. Waiver of Section 745.105 (h), Ord. Code. 24 Section 745.105 (h), Ord Code which requires that all street name 25 changes be for the entire length of the street is waived because 26 the proposed street name of "Stingray Parkway" will align with the 27 name of the mascot for Atlantic Coast High School which school is 28 located on the road designated to be changed.

Section 11. Directing Legislative Services to forward a
 copy to the Planning and Development Department, Parks, Recreation
 and Community Services Department and Public Works Department. The

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1 Chief of Legislative Services is requested to send a copy of this 2 legislation, once enacted, to the Planning and Development 3 Department, Addressing Unit, for processing, implementation, and 4 coordination with 911 Emergency, Fire and Rescue Department, the 5 Post Office, Public Works Department, Traffic Engineering Division, 6 Parks, Recreation and Community Services Department and other 7 affected agencies and organizations.

8 Section 12. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become
9 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective
10 without the Mayor's signature.
