The extended grant period commences July 11, 2022, and continues through September 30, 2024. No City match is required to receive these additional grant funds.

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Section 2. The purpose of the appropriation in 8 Purpose. 9 Section 1 is to provide additional funding to support the goals and 10 objectives of the Program. Program efforts include providing supportive services, nutrition services, and preventive health 11 12 services to family caregivers in response to coronavirus, giving preference to older individuals (ages 60 and older) with greatest 13 economic and social needs. Crisis assistance may include, but is not 14 limited to, COVID-19 vaccination outreach, education, aiding older 15 adults with vaccinations, and other associated services; as well as 16 17 resources addressing social isolation, including activities for investments in technological equipment, to facilitate these efforts. 18

A copy of the ElderSource Standard Contract American Rescue Plan Act (Agreement Number: RP21-JSSP), together with Amendment One effective September 1, 2021, and Amendment Two effective January 1, 2023, setting forth the terms and conditions relative to receipt and expenditure of the aforementioned grant funds, has been placed **On File** with the Office of Legislative Services.
