The funding above is an appropriation of \$12,170,201.42, including \$11,865,266.00 in annual grant funds from Florida Department of Economic Opportunity, through the Florida Housing Finance Corporation, and \$304,935.42 in program income. These funds will be used to support the State Housing Initiatives Partnership (SHIP) program. The SHIP program grant and income funds must be committed to eligible projects no later than June 30, 2025 and must be fully expended for completed projects no later than June 30, 2026.

Section 2. Florida Housing 11 Purpose. The Finance Corporation provides funding to local governments as an incentive to 12 13 partnerships that produce and preserve affordable create homeownership and multifamily housing. The SHIP program was designed 14 15 to serve very low, low, and moderate-income families. SHIP funds may be used for emergency repairs, new construction, rehabilitation, down 16 payment and closing costs assistance, impact fees, construction and 17 gap financing, mortgage buy-downs, acquisition of property for 18 19 affordable housing, matching dollars for federal housing grants and 20 programs, homeownership counseling, and the Foreclosure Intervention 21 Program. The Schedule of Proposed Funding detailing the proposed uses of the SHIP funds is attached hereto as **Exhibit 2** and incorporated 22 23 herein by this reference. A copy of the state of Florida Projected SHIP Estimates for Fiscal Year 2023-2024 is attached hereto as Exhibit 24 25 3.

26 Section 3. Approval of Positions. There are hereby 27 approved the positions more fully described in R.C. 23-117, attached 28 hereto as Exhibit 4 and incorporated herein by this reference. Said 29 positions are fully funded by SHIP grant dollars and will provide 30 services in support of the SHIP program.
